We bow during the next verse and response:

And the Word was made flesh.

All **And dwelt among us.**

Hail Mary, full of grace ...

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.

All **That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.**

Let us pray.

Pour forth, we beseech thee, O Lord, thy grace into our hearts that
as we have known the incarnation of thy son Jesus Christ,
by the message of an angel,
so by his ✠ cross and passion
we may be brought to the glory of his resurrection,
through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Memorial of the Resurrection (Regina Cæli)

From Easter Day to Pentecost we sing:
