The Greeting

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Prayers of Penitence

with suitable penitential sentences, the Kyrie eleison is used

The priest says

May almighty God have mercy on us, Forgive us our sins, And bring us to everlasting life; Through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

The Collect

The priest introduces a period of silent prayer with the words 'Let us pray' or a more specific bidding. The Collect is said, and all respond Amen.

The Liturgy of the Word

Scripture Reading

At the end the reader may say

This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Gospel Reading (stand)

An acclamation heralds the Gospel reading.

Alleluia. Alleluia.

A verse of scripture is read

All: Alleluia

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

 ${\it Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to N.}$

Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Prayers of the People

Lord, hear us.

Lord, graciously hear us.

Merciful Father,

accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The Peace

The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

The sign of peace is not exchanged

Preparation of the Altar and Gifts

Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation.
Through your goodness we have this bread
to set before you, which earth has given and human hands
have made. It will become for us the bread of life.
Blessed be God for ever.

Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation.
Through your goodness we have this wine
to set before you, fruit of the vine and work of human hands.
It will become our spiritual drink.

Blessed be God for ever.

The priest says the 'prayer at the preparation of the Table'

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you and also with you.
Lift up your hearts.
We lift them to the Lord.
Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give thanks and praise.

The priest reads the preface, then all say

Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

The priest continues the prayer, recalling the words and actions of Jesus at the Last Supper. One of the following acclamations is used:

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died:

Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

Or

Jesus Christ is Lord:

Lord, by your cross and resurrection you have set us free;
You are the Saviour of the world.

at the conclusion of the prayer the priest says:

By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. **Amen.**



All sit/kneel and silence may be kept.

The Communion Rite

The Lord's Prayer

Let us pray with confidence to the Father, in the words our Saviour gave us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen

Lamb of God

The priest breaks the consecrated bread

Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us.

Invitation to Communion

This is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Happy are those who are called to his supper. Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

Receiving the Holy Sacrament

After receiving communion, the priest will move in front of the altar and, raising the sacrament, will say The Body of Christ.

All reply: Amen

Those who wish are then invited by a steward to approach the dais to receive Holy Communion. This will be done in silence as we have already replied "Amen" to the words "The Body of Christ". After receiving, the priest will stand away from you so that you may consume the sacrament without feeling you have to move quickly.
