Introduction to the day

Today is a combination of a Retreat for the Day along with the annual Ride+Stride.

The Ride+Stride is a campaign organised by the National Churches Trust to raise money for the local churches trusts around the country that make grants to support maintaining historic places of worship. Any sponsorship money is shared equally between the local churches trust and a church of choice.

The Day Retreat idea stemmed from the Parish Retreats that Sarah Cottrill has organised previously. Sarah included days out walking that incorporated opportunities for prayer.

Peter, was staying there. While Peter was still thinking about the vision, the Spirit said to him, 'Look, three men are searching for you. Now get up, go down, and go with them without hesitation; for I have sent them.' So Peter went down to the men and said, 'I am the one you are looking for; what is the reason for your coming?' They answered, 'Cornelius, a centurion, an upright and God-fearing man, who is well spoken of by the whole Jewish nation, was directed by a holy angel to send for you to come to his house and to hear what you have to say.' So Peter invited them in and gave them lodging.

The next day he got up and went with them, and some of the believers from Joppa accompanied him. The following day they came to Caesarea. Cornelius was expecting them and had called together his relatives and close friends. On Peter's arrival Cornelius met him, and falling at his feet, worshipped him. Walk I: from St John's to St Mark's

Walking from St John's Church, we follow the ancient route along Slingpool Walk and then meander past Chapter Meadows and along the river to the foot bridge at Diglis. After crossing the river we walk through Cherry Tree Nature Reserve before arriving at St Mark's in the Cherry Orchard.

Bible Reflection

At St Mark's we pause to reflect on the reading from Acts 10.17-33, which we heard at Morning Prayer, and can be found on pages 5 and 6. This will be used as our source for discussion as part of Walking Church.

Walk 2: from St Mark's to Whittington Walking Church

From St Mark's, we follow the course of Duck Brook as we walk through Bath Road Park and Battenhall Park before walking through the fields to reach the A4440. We then stick to the footpath as we walk to Whittington village.

This walk will be our "Walking Church" section of the day. As we walk through the fields, we will discuss the reading from Acts 10.17-33 that we heard at Morning Prayer and which we reflected on at St Mark's and can be found on pages 5 and 6.

At St Philip & St James' Church, Whittington, we will say '**Prayer During the Day**' before enjoying either a picnic lunch or a meal at *The Swan*.


