Wild Worship at St Peters – every 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month



Wild Worship is a contemporary fresh expression, enabling people to engage with the Christian faith outside of the traditional church setting. It is an all-age gathering, informal and relaxed and usually happens outdoors, weather permitting. Through our gathered worship, we explore, pray and engage with Jesus, seeking God in creation and the natural world. Wild Worship has roots in the fifth Mark of Mission, to Treasure what God has given us, emphasising good stewardship towards the whole of creation.

What happens at Wild Worship? We normally gather in the Church Hall for light refreshments. Shortly after, we move outdoors and begin with a prayer. A team member will read a passage from Scripture leading to an activity relating to what has been said. The activities vary, from making damper bread over a firepit to musical instruments from natural materials or a poetry prayer walk. Each Wild Worship is different and aims to help those gathered to meet with God by creating a safe space to ask questions and share thoughts about our faith with others.
