BIBLE READINGS

First Reading: Proverbs 8 v.22-36 (Lorraine Wheeler, St. Ouen's and Bethlehem Methodist Churches.)

- ²² The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago.
- ²³ Ages ago I was set up,

at the first, before the beginning of the earth.

- ²⁴ When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water.
- ²⁵ Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth—

²⁶ when he had not yet made earth and fields,

or the world's first bits of soil.

²⁷ When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep,

Second Reading: John 1 v.1-10 (*Mary Richardson, Bethlehem Methodist Church*) ¹ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being ⁴ in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. ⁶ There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. ⁸ He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. ⁹ The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him.
