Baroque Alchemy: Piers Adams and Lyndy Mayle



Piers Adams is widely regarded as one of the greatest recorder players of our time, with his iconic baroque ensemble Red Priest, and as soloist. He has long held a dream to combine the simplicity of the recorder with the universe of possibilities offered by modern-day synth technology, which, since crossing paths with Lyndy, has led to the formation of Baroque Alchemy.

Lyndy Mayle studied piano and harpsichord at the Royal College of Music, where she was a multiple prizewinning student. Baroque Alchemy marks a welcome return to the concert platform - and to her early music roots.

Born in Edinburgh and living in Leeds, Yuanfan Yang is establishing himself as one of the most interesting and distinctive musical voices of today, as a multi-faceted award-winning pianist, composer, and improviser. A London Royal College of Music and Royal Academy of Music first-class graduate, Yuanfan was recently awarded the International Artist Diploma from the Royal Northern College of Music. His interpretations of Schumann and Liszt 'rivalled those of the young Ashkenazy' (International Piano Magazine), and his own compositions have been praised for their 'soulful poignancy' in The Observer.

How to find us

Lyddington is 1½ miles south of Uppingham, east of the A6003 Corby to Oakham road. Main Street runs north-south. Church Lane has a small mediaeval watch tower on the corner. hundred yards south of the Old White Hart, where plentiful free offstreet parking is available in the field (not in the car




park, please); please follow the signs. A torch can be helpful to guide you back to your car.

The postcode is LE15 9LR.

There is limited parking in Main Street, but please park on the opposite side to Church Lane. Please do not park across driveways or obstruct access by residents, through traffic and emergency vehicles.

Parking in Church Lane is for blue badge holders only.
