



Here is the second in our series of Jewish festivals. The next one to be celebrated is Rosh

Hashanah, the Jewish New Year. It is a major two-day holiday celebrated in autumn- 23 September this year. It includes a service in the synagogue that begins with the sounding of the shofar, an instrument made from the



horn of a ram. Everyone repents of their mistakes in the past year and resolves to do better



in the new year. Common foods include apples dipped in honey and challah bread. Rosh Hashanah marks the beginning of what are known as the High Holidays, the Ten Days of Repentance or the Days of Awe, which conclude on

Yom Kippur. It is said that on Rosh Hashanah, God opens the books of life and death. The righteous are inscribed in the book of life, and the unrighteous in the book of death. You have 10 days to make sure your name is on the right page. On Yom Kippur judgments are finalized, and the books sealed.

The month of September is regarded by many Christian Churches as **Creationtide** or the Season of Creation. There was an ancient belief that God created the world on its first day. At the start of the Old Testament the writer of the book of Genesis sets out our responsibilities as humans created by God in his image to take care of the world in which he has placed us. In Genesis 1, God's first instructions to the humans he has created is how to manage the world in which they live. Adam's first job was to care for the Garden of Eden in which God had placed him. We don't own the earth: we have stewardship over it. This means that we safeguard it on behalf of its Creator: 'The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world and those who live in



it' says the psalmist in Psalm 24. In recent years we haven't done a good job of stewarding God's creation: we've destroyed natural habitats by cutting down the forests and draining the wetlands; we have polluted the land and the sea with rubbish like waste plastic which will never go away; we have continued to burn fossil fuels even after we knew what effect that would have on climate change. We have just had the hottest summer ever in this country, but that doesn't stop us contributing to global

warming. We need to reduce our carbon footprint and move towards more sustainable living. As Christians we need to set an example in this area: the church is now taking a role in this through initiatives like Eco Church, for which we have the bronze award here at St Paul's. We look now to the next generation, our young people, to

Paul's. We look now to the next generation, our young people, to redress some of the wrongs committed by the older generation and work together with other nations to save our planet and our way of life before it is too late.

A prayer for Creationtide: Holy God, earth and air and water are your creation, and every living thing belongs to you: have mercy on us as climate change confronts us. Give us the will and the courage to simplify the way we live, to reduce the energy we use, to share the resources you provide, and to bear the cost of change. Forgive our past mistakes and send us your Spirit, with wisdom in present controversies and vision for the future to which you call us, in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
