

History & Points of Interest



Our church dates back to the late 12th century and was built using local Cheddleton stone.

The Sanctuary refurbishment and re-ordering of much of the church was undertaken in the late 1860s largely supervised by the churchwarden of the time, Sir Thomas Wardle, and his wife, Lady Elizabeth. Sir Thomas enjoyed a close collaboration with William Morris, which resulted in the large number of beautiful treasures that we hold, including most of the stained-glass windows.

The triptych behind the altar is of special interest and was loaned to the Victoria and Albert Museum for six months.

During the 1972 renovations of the sanctuary, two lead coffins, believed to contain monks from Dieulacres, were discovered and remain there today.

The belfry contains six bells, dating from 1632 to 1864. Tours of the church and tower are available by appointment.

A loop system is installed in Church. If you wear a hearing aid, please tune it to 'T'.

If you need gluten free communion wafers, please make yourself known to the vicar, a churchwarden or any church officials.

2 Corinthians

4.1 - 6

Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. We have renounced the shameful things that one hides; we refuse to practise cunning or to falsify God's word; but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God. And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.

For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus sake. For it is the God who said, Let light shine out of darkness, who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

This is the word of the Lord.

9.9 - 13

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew. Glory to you, O Lord.

As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth; and he said to him, 'Follow me'.

And he got up and followed him.

And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax-collectors and sinners came and were sitting with him and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, Why does your teacher eat with tax-collectors and sinners? But when he heard this, he said, 'Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick.

Go and learn what this means, I desire mercy, not sacrifice. For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.


