#### October 2025

Dear Friends,



It was with great pleasure that I recently accompanied members of the Stourdene

church community to the Baptism Confirmation service at All Saints church at Burton Dassett. The service on 7th September was led by the new Bishop of Coventry, Bishop Sophie. At the service 4 people from our community were confirmed - where a person, teenager or adult, publicly affirms their commitment to following Christ. The continuation of a deeper, more personal spiritual journey in their faith.

This led me to think about my own journey of faith. I grew up in a Christian family, went to Sunday school, attended daily worship assemblies throughout my school years, and festival services at church (Christmas, Easter, Harvest), but interestingly refused to be confirmed as a teenager. I recognised it was something I had to want to do and mean and it wasn't until I was in my mid-twenties that I chose to be confirmed. However, even then going to church wasn't high on my priority list although I did attend church most weeks with my husband. I then had a long period in my life after my mother died when I unconsciously turned away from church. I worked shifts in those days whilst working for a degree in my own time, so in retrospect I now realise I used that as my excuse for missing church. I hadn't lost my faith I just had no interest in going to church. I can so understand that feeling.

If you ask people where is the place where you feel closest to God, invariably people will say it's on a beach, in the countryside, on a walk, on a mountain, in a forest, in my garden, in nature. That's how I felt, and I still often feel today. Being outside, having time to relax, breathe deeply, listen to the birds and marvel at the beauty of nature I discover how wonderful creation is. It feels so special and spiritual. I even felt like that last week whist walking 5 miles in the pouring rain along the coastal path not far from Fort William in Scotland. It was so beautiful, so calming and yes, I was soaked to the skin but the scenery was spectacular and it was oh so spiritual. I found myself thinking if only I could kindle that feeling in church, share this with others but then I realised, remembered Jesus did this, he met people on mountains, on the beach, by rivers. He had no church buildings; he had no set services. I decided we should do that. Meet outdoors, get back to nature. So, watch this space. Let's see what we can do to kindle that spiritual feeling, that faith in nature and meeting God in creation. But in the meantime, I urge you to go for a walk, sit in your garden, look at the nature around you. You could join in the weekly prayer walk. Look on the church notice board to see were we're meeting. May God bless you as you listen to the voice of nature and observe the beauty of creation.

#### **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS - Highlights from the September Meeting**



#### Tackling Speeding in the Village

Traffic speed remains a major concern. With Warwickshire Highways no longer supporting vehicle-activated signs, the council is considering alternatives. These may include placing signs on private land with the owner's permission or introducing advisory limits around schools. Councillors agreed that reducing speeding will stay high on the agenda until effective solutions are found.

#### Freedom of the Parish for David Hughes

In recognition of his long and dedicated service as parish councillor and chairman, David Hughes has been awarded the Freedom of the Parish. David accepted the honour with thanks, and a formal presentation will take place in due course.

#### Clearing Footpaths

Overgrown hedgerows are increasingly blocking village footpaths, making them difficult for residents to use. The council will be writing to property owners to remind them of their responsibility to keep hedges trimmed. Where this does not happen, Warwickshire County Council will be asked to follow up.

#### **Defibrillators in Safe Hands**

To ensure the village defibrillators are always ready for use in an emergency, the council has appointed Red Horse Vale First Responders to manage and maintain the defibs at the community centre, the Chequers Pub and in Fulready. This will provide peace of mind that regular checks are carried out. The possibility of relocating the school defib unit to the village shop is also being progressed.

#### **Community Centre Improvements**

The community centre remains well-used, but there is a need for building upgrades. Insulation and heating are particular concerns, and a professional audit will be carried out to prioritise improvements.

The October meeting will take place on Wednesday October 8<sup>th</sup> starting at 7.30 p.m. and it is hoped a representative from Warwickshire Police will attend to discuss vehicle theft and steps residents may take to better protect their properties.




#### **ALDERMINSTER GARDENING CLUB**






The Stratford-upon-Avon Astronomical Society meets every first and third Tuesday at 8pm (doors open at 7.30pm) at Alderminster Village Hall. Everyone is welcome, especially beginners and those wanting to learn more. The first Tuesday is a club night, in October that will be on 7th October

and the speaker on the third Tuesday 21st October 2025 will be Steve Warbis, from the Macclesfield Astronomical Society, with a talk called "Messier objects and how they map the Milky Way". Please note that the speakers usually start quite promptly at 8pm.

Each month one of our members, Adrian Wakeham, writes an article on aspects of astronomical observation.






#### Satellites and other things that move in the night sky.

On a clear night, stars, planets and the moon are visible to the naked eye. What you may not know is that the International Space Station (ISS) and smaller satellites are also visible. The easy distinguishing factor for these is that they visibly move across the sky, generally in a west to east(ish) direction. Unlike aeroplanes, which are usually identifiable because of their flashing navigation lights, satellites appear as a steady light of varying brightness, the ISS, for example, is highly visible. The satellites themselves are not lit but are usually reflecting the light from the sun. The schedule for numerous satellites passing overhead can be found in various apps such as Heavens-Above.

Normal satellites are constantly seen, if you keep an eye to the skies. They are becoming a more regular sight, as Elon Musk's Space X (amongst others) launch more and more small communication satellites to make the Skynet coverage of the globe fuller. One problem is that they are cluttering up skies. Astrophotography and very large telescopes are finding them trailing across their pictures.

Sometimes as Space X's Starlink satellites are being deployed, you can see a line of them, (I've seen 30 in a row) trailing across the sky. These are known as sky trains. If you see a satellite going from east to west, the chances are that it's a Chinese satellite.

Best time to see satellites is just after sunset or before dawn, for an hour or so, as they get the last of the sun's rays, before going into the earth's shadow.





Club nights offer more information on what to look out for each month. If it is clear we do some observing just outside the Village Hall, so please join us. There is no charge initially to come along and find out more, but if you do want to become a member then the fee is just £15 a year and it's free if you are in full time education. #### Calling all men 40 and over!

Wellesbourne & District Lions are again sponsoring a **PSA Prostate Cancer Screening Event** It's just a simple 10-minute PSA blood test.

Prostate cancer generally produces no symptoms in its early stages, so it is important to diagnose the disease early while it is still potentially curable.

At last year's event 100 men were tested, of those 95 received a "green" test result, requiring no immediate further action with re-test recommendations of between 1 and 3 years depending on their result. 5 men had "red or amber" results recommended follow up action with their GP for further investigation.






