What is Baptism?

Baptism and **Christening** are the same thing. Baptism comes from the Greek word that means "to dip" so you will see that water has an important role in this service. Christening refers to the fact that baptism begins with Christ's baptism and through the baptism we celebrate today we share in Christ's baptism. This is the way that we receive the life Christ offers to us. We are now alive "in Christ".

Baptism is a wonderful beginning, the start of a lifelong journey rather than a single event. It is not a journey we travel alone. We are joined with all of God's baptised people, the Church.

The baptism today takes place in the **Parish Eucharist**. As well as giving us his baptism to share Jesus also gave his followers the special meal, the eucharist, where we share his body and blood in the bread and wine that is blessed, broken and shared.

Our Lord Jesus Christ has told us that to enter the kingdom of heaven we must be born again of water and the Spirit, and has given us baptism as the sign and seal of this new birth. Here we are washed by the Holy Spirit and made clean. Here we are clothed with Christ, dying to sin that we may live his risen life. As children of God, we have a new dignity and God calls us to fullness of life.

Introduction to Holy Baptism, Common Worship

What is a Patronal Festival?

The majority of Church of England churches are named for a Saint: St John, St George, St Giles and so on. Most of these saints have at least one day in the calendar assigned to them as their feast day, and churches often take that feast day as an opportunity to celebrate not just the life of the saint they are named after, but also the foundation and activity of the church itself.

Our primary dedication here is to St Mary, the mother of Jesus, who in honour of her pre-eminence among the Saints has several feast days, one of which is tomorrow, 8th September. She is our patron saint, which is why this service is known as our Patronal Festival. Our readings and hymns celebrate Mary's great "yes" to God, who willingly accepted the angel's message and became the mother of Christ.


The Dismissal

And Mary said, 'My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts.

The Decision

When you looked with favour on your lowly servant you remembered your promise of mercy and gave the world through her your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.

Through him the hosts of heaven adore you and rejoice in your presence for ever.

May our voices join with theirs in the triumphant hymn of praise:

As the hymn is sung a collection for the work of the church is taken, and the elements of bread and wine are brought to the altar with the offerings of the people.

All things come from you, and of your own do we give you.

Eucharistic Prayer (remain standing)

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? I turn to Christ.
Do you submit to Christ as Lord? I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way the truth and the life? I come to Christ.

Signing with the Cross

The president makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptism candidate, saying

Christ claims you for his own.
Receive the sign of his cross.
Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified

All Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

Prayer over the Water


The president stands before the water of baptism and says

Praise God who made heaven and earth, **Who keeps his promise for ever.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

The Cross is the sign that reminds us that Jesus has given his life for us.

When we make the sign of the cross we receive it as a "badge" to show that we belong to Jesus and to his people the Church, travelling together the way of faith.



When we make the sign of the cross we use HOLY OIL. This is blessed by the Bishop just before Easter and using it is a link to the wider Church. Oil has traditionally been used for preparing for a task or as a sign of celebration!



Water is a powerful symbol.
It reminds us that God

It also reminds us of the new life offered to us through baptism



We remember also the waters of creation.



In the water we use today we share in the baptism of Jesus.
