### PRAYER FOR THIS SUNDAY

### REFLECTIONS......REV. ROBERT SIMPSON

Hope you are enjoying the beauty of the trees around us as the leaves change and we are surrounded by these beautiful autumn colours. Our Old Testament reading this week is one of the most significant in the Old Testament. It signifies a change in direction for God's people. Up to that point the land of Israel was their focus. Sadly, then as now, the Jews had neglected their founding promise to Abraham, Genesis 12:3b, "through you all peoples shall be blessed!"

This is the founding promise of both the Jews and the the Church. Judah had been conquered by the Babylonians and its leading people taken back to Babylon. Those left thought those exiles were being punished and that God would deliver those remaining in Judah. Jeremiah's words to the exiles turn this on its head.

"Work for the good of the cities where I have made you go as prisoners. Pray to me on their behalf, because if they are prosperous, you will be prosperous too." Jeremiah 29:7. God is acting towards bringing the Jews out of their narrow view of the world. It was the exiles and others who were later taken into exile who provided the communities in which the Church was planted and from which it spread. This challenge is for us. It is too easy to focus on the church and its survival rather than seeing God's new thing.

### CANTINUED ....

There are many places in the world where people cannot hear the good news of Jesus. So what is God doing? He is bringing them to us. Are we open to God's call? Do we see migrants as a threat or as God call us to an opportunity? Let us support Gloucestershire Action for Refugees and Asylum Seekers (GARAS) in their ministry to asylum seekers.

Have you heard of the silent revival? There is a sea change in how the teens and twenties are viewing faith. Atheism is out and there is a new openness to faith. Let us use the opportunities we have to be open to our children and grandchildren, nephews and nieces about what we believe.

The folk of Jeremiah's time were fearful of the changes in their time- let us be encouraged by God's words and actions and use the opportunities he is giving us in the power of the Spirit.


