

A pilgrimage to Iona (Columba's Isle) Rev Hilary Shedlock writes:

At the end of September Phil and I made the long journey to the island of Iona, which is off the

west coast of Scotland. We travelled with 25 people from across Manchester and beyond, by train, ferry and coach and car. All week we were blessed with blue skies and gentle breezes in the day and clear, star-filled heavens at night. The island is small, beautiful and peaceful. There are about 120 inhabitants, including 23 children, who were welcoming and friendly, along with sheep and cattle peacefully grazing on the hills.

We stayed at Bishops House which is a retreat

house for the Scottish Episcopal Church. At its centre is St Columba's chapel, which we used daily for Morning Prayer, Communion and Evening Compline. Across the next field was the Abbey, where services were held every evening.

Columba and his twelve monks travelled from Ireland and landed on Iona

on the day of Pentecost 563, where they founded a monastery. The monastery was hugely successful and may have played a role in the conversion to Christianity of the people of presentday Scotland, and was certainly central to the conversion of the Anglo-Saxon kingdom of Northumbria, with links to St Cuthbert and St Aiden of Lindisfarne on the east coast. Led by Revd Daniel Burton and Mark, Bishop of Middleton, we spent our days walking across the island listening and praying, fortified by good food provided by the staff at Bishops House. While staying at the retreat house we had to do our share of the hospitality, clearing the tables after meals and providing worship in the chapel, which helped us get to know each other, and now we have 25 new friends.



One day we travelled by boat to Staffa, the sea was so calm, we were able to sail right inside Fingal's cave.

The current Abbey church is not from St Columba's time but was rebuilt in the early 1900's based on a Benedictine Abbey founded in 1203. It is now home to the Iona Community, who are from many backgrounds and denominations and

who seek to promote peace and social justice and to discover new approaches to worship. We attended the Sunday Morning Communion service at the Abbey. At the end we sang;

We will walk with God, my brothers, we will walk with God.

We will walk with God, my sisters, we will walk with God.

We will go rejoicing till the kingdom has come.

We will go rejoicing till the kingdom has come.

And we were invited to stay for coffee, where we were given two biscuits and invited to share one with a stranger. This, for me, summed up our time on Iona.

Harvest thanks! A huge thankyou to everyone who contributed towards our three



harvest celebrations- at St Paul's, St Andrew's and St Paul's School- and for all the wonderful donations to St James' Food Pantry- two carloads of goods and over £100 in cash. Our special thanks go to Broughton House for their fantastic hampers: it was wonderful to have residents and staff at the service at St Paul's.
