Professor Adrian Low has been a teacher in FE and HE, a statistician, computer scientist, educationalist and Associate Dean in the Faculty of Computing, Engineering and Science at the University of Staffordshire, and is now a full-time priest in the Church of England and Area Dean for Newport.

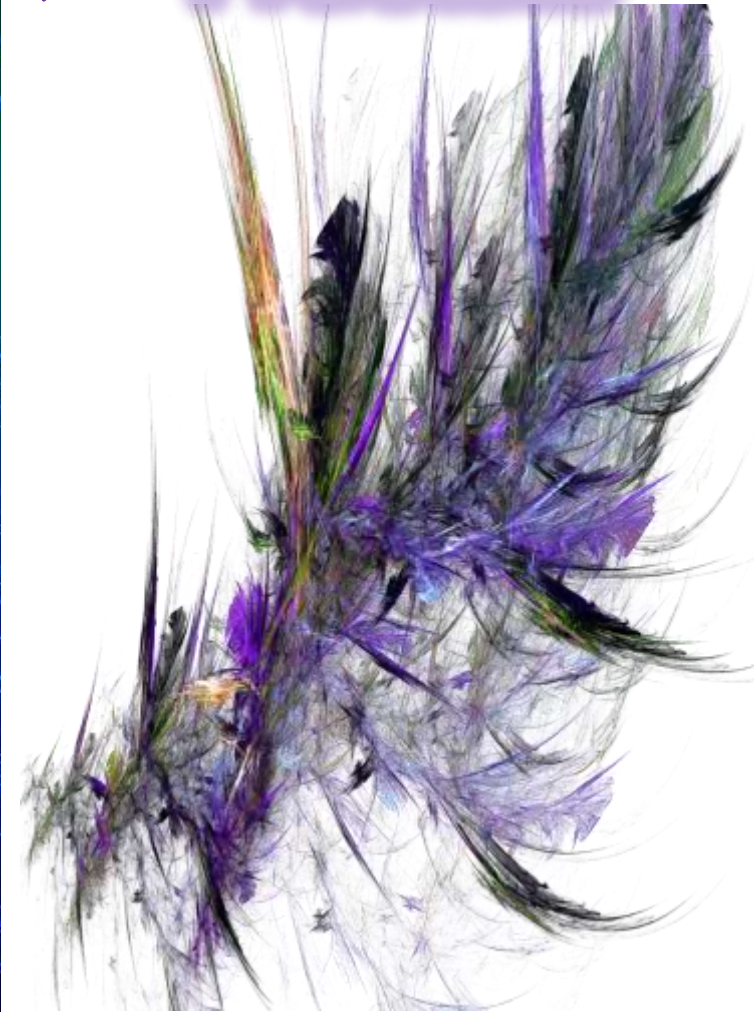
