Dear Friends,

Christianity has either been well received by the world or very poorly. However, what does it mean to be a "Christian"? I was astounded to



discover that there are over the 45000 denominations of Christians globally. Christians who have small or large differences in their interpretation of how to worship and follow the faith. It's therefore not surprising that people are confused about what we believe, and how we should live our lives as followers of Christ.

I often meet people who say, 'I'm a bad Christian' and apologise for not going to church. However, they do have a Christian faith and try to live following the Christian way. Essentially, being a Christian means believing in Jesus Christ as the Son of God and saviour and following Jesus' ways and teachings. This involves living a life of love, kindness, and generosity towards others, fighting for justice, dignity and inclusion for all and seeking forgiveness for our sins and wrongdoing.

The distinction between a "good" and "bad" Christian is moot in the grand scheme of salvation. Our deeds, while significant, are fruits of our faith, not prerequisites for salvation. It's often difficult to know where to start to talk about being a Christian. Many people have heard the various stories from the Bible but how do we translate these to our present-day life.

I've recently introduced some of our community to a book by Dave Tomlinson "How to be a **bad** Christian - **and a better human being**". In his book Dave discusses the difference between legalism, religion and simply being a loving follower of Christ. Love is the central theme of his book which tackles delicate issues such as how to show love to the LGBTQ+ community, how to throw away our religious judgments, or how to interpret the bible when we find 'contradictions'. This book is simply about loving our neighbours like us. It is enriched by stories and testimonies of real people which helps the reader to open his/her mind to a world that needs the love of God more than ever before.

We will be reading this and discussing our reactions to what is said. Dave is a Vicar and in re-read his book I was reminded of an occasion when someone said to Dave "I'm a bad Christian; I don't come to church." In response Dave said "No need to apologise. Most people don't come to church. But if I thought for one moment that God gave a monkey's fart whether or not you come to church, I'd become an atheist here and now! He goes on to say... Don't get me wrong: I think there are good reasons to be part of a church community, (which he discusses in the book.) But I can't believe that God divides the world between churchgoers and non-churchgoers, or between people who believe and people who don't believe. What an absurd idea. Surely God has more sophistication to his judgement than this! Surely God must be more interested in the kind of people we are, the choices we make in life and the way we treat people than in what we do with our Sunday mornings?"

I have to be honest and say I agree with Dave. Do you? Or do you feel this is heretical? This book does say things that make you think, and you may not agree with. For example, I and many believe

that being part of a church community is an important aspect of Christian life for many, as they support one another and express their faith together.

Come and join us reading and discussing what's written in this book.

1st Tuesday of each month 1.30pm at Ettington church. Starting on 2nd December.

What a weekend we had with our latest Village Bingo and Breakfast events on the 3rd and 4th of October - two of Ettington's best-loved community get-togethers!

Friday night bingo once again drew a fantastic crowd to the community centre, with plenty of laughter, a few tense silences, and the occasional triumphant shout of "Bingo!" We played five games with cash prizes ranging from £5 to £50, plus one bonus game where the full house jackpot reached a whopping £95! There was also the ever-popular raffle, packed with classic prizes, and of course, the licensed bar and our much-loved chilli supper - sometimes hot, sometimes mild, sometimes somewhere in between, but always delicious! It was wonderful to see so many new faces join our regulars, and together we raised just over £450 to support the upkeep of our community centre.

No sooner had the bingo cards been packed away than the village breakfast team were up bright and early on Saturday morning, frying, flipping, and brewing for over 100 hungry villagers. The full English-style breakfast (with veggie and meat options) went down a treat - eggs, bacon, sausages, beans, tomatoes, and hash browns, all made with locally sourced meat, free-range eggs, and fairtrade coffee. This time, the breakfast raised just over £400 for our primary school, a brilliant result and a huge credit to the team of volunteers who make it all happen.

Both events are the perfect reminder of what makes Ettington so special - good food, good company, and a good cause at heart. Our next Festive Bingo and Breakfast weekend will take place on Friday 5th and Saturday 6th December - so make sure to save the date for some pre-Christmas cheer!

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The October meeting of Ettington Parish Council was held on Wednesday October 8th, and was attended by councillors and 24 members of the public. Discussions ranged from vehicle crime and road safety, to planning development pressures and the upkeep of community facilities.

Police Update: Tackling Vehicle Crime

Local officer PC Sid Hammond joined the meeting to brief councillors and residents on recent vehicle thefts in Ettington and surrounding villages. He explained that keyless car thefts remain a growing problem and urged residents to take simple precautions such as using Faraday pouches to block key signals and steering locks as visible deterrents.

Residents also raised he idea of installing Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras to monitor traffic through the village. While police system compatibility remains a hurdle, the council will continue to explore the options with the police and Warwickshire County Council

Road Safety Concerns at the Crossroads

Residents raised concerns about the dangerous staggered crossroads junction, following another serious accident. Suggestions included clearer signage, improved lighting, and reviewing the existing speed limit.

The council will continue to push Warwickshire County Council to take further action, and request another site visit. In the meantime, they will push for the cutting back of overgrown hedges which would make an immediate difference to visibility and the replacement of road traffic signs.

Development Pressures and Community Benefits

Councillors have been made aware that Stratford District Council's ongoing lack of a five-year housing supply leaves local communities with less control over planning decisions.

The council agreed to continue working with SDC and developers to ensure that any new housing delivers tangible benefits under Section 106 agreements, such as investment in local amenities and infrastructure.

Community Facilities: Maintenance and Upgrades

The council reviewed updates on the Community Centre and sports facilities. The need for improved lighting and pitch maintenance was discussed, and the council will be seeking grant funding.

It was agreed that a separate meeting should be held to look specifically at the management and maintenance of the MUGA (multi-use games area), ensuring it remains well used.

Pressure on Community Centre Parking

With increased use of the Community Centre, councillors considered ways to expand parking capacity. One option would create new spaces on grass behind the MUGA, using a plastic and sand base.

Further information and alternative quotes will be gathered before the council applies for grants to support the work.

Keeping the local footpaths clear

The council will be asking Warwickshire County Council to contact residents whose hedges are obstructing pavements, forcing pedestrians into the road. It is each property owner's responsibility to keep hedges on their land trimmed back, ensuring safe and accessible pathways throughout the village.

The next Parish Council meeting will take place on **Wednesday 12 November 2025 at 7.30 p.m. in the Community Centre.**

Astronomical Society News



The Stratford-upon-Avon Astronomical Society meets every first and third **Tuesday at 8pm (doors open at 7.30pm) at Alderminster Village Hall.** Everyone is welcome, especially beginners and those wanting to learn more. The first Tuesday is a club night, in November that will be on **4**th **November** and the

speaker on the third **Tuesday 18th November 2025** will be Simon Toogood, from Leicester University, with a talk called "Research on the atmospheres of the giant planets using the James Webb Space Telescope". Please note that the speakers usually start quite promptly at 8pm.

Each month one of our members, Adrian Wakeham, writes an article on aspects of astronomical observation.

The Moon's Travels.

This month, we shall follow the moon as it traverses the night sky and how it interacts with the planets of our solar system and the stars.

On the 1st of November the Moon will be more than half lit and growing in brightness and this is known as a waxing gibbous moon and rises in the SE in the evening. The bright 'star' to the left on the first and the right on the second, is Saturn. With large binoculars or a small telescope, Saturn's rings become visible, as does its largest moon, Titan.

Then on the 5th we have a so called 'super moon'. All this means is, the moon, which has an elliptical orbit, is at its closet position to earth, making it 14 % larger and 30% brighter, than when it is a full moon at its furthest point, as viewed from earth. There is likely to be plenty of mentions of this in the press, and probably astrologers.

The 6th, sees the moon to the right of the Pleiades. Uranus will be visible close by. You'll need binoculars or a telescope to see Uranus. It will be 3 moon diameters away from the moon around 7pm.

On the 9th and 10th, the moon passes through Gemini. It goes below Castor and Pollox, but above Jupiter. Binoculars will make visible some of Jupiter's 4 Galilean moons. With a fairly large telescope the bands and Great Red Spot become visible.

The Leonid meteor shower peaks around November 17th and the Moon will be out of the way as it is a slim waning crescent. By the 18th and 19th, the moon won't rise until well after midnight.



Also on the 18th, just before sunrise, in the east, the moon passes by Venus. It will be fairly bright, but close to the horizon. A week or so later, Venus and the moon will be gone, but Mercury will take its place. It won't be as bright but will be visible to the naked eye.

By the 29th, the moon returns to the evening sky and is visiting Saturn again.

Club nights offer more information on what to look out for each month If it is clear we do some observing just outside the Village Hall, so please join us. There is no charge initially to come along



and find out more, but if you do want to become a member then the fee is just £15 a year and it's free if you are in full time education.






