

THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST

The tradition of Nine Lessons and Carols dates to 1880s Cornwall when Truro Cathedral was being constructed. The first services were held in the large wooden building that served as the temporary cathedral and organised by the then dean (later to become Archbishop of Canterbury) Edward White Benson. This service was later adapted in 1918 by Eric Milner-White, the dean of Chapel at King's College, Cambridge, who composed the bidding prayer at the beginning of the service. The simple beauty of this service has become much loved and very popular not only in England, but around the world. Nine Lessons and Carols is broadcast annually by the BBC World Service.

The service takes us through readings from Holy Scripture beginning with Genesis and traces the journey of God's faithfulness to His beloved Creation and particularly to men and women – human beings He has created in His own image and likeness. We hear of the disobedience of Adam and Eve in the garden of Eden, and how they hide from the presence of God, even as God searches for them. As we hear the rest of the lessons, we find God constant and faithful in His promises to human beings, culminating in God's sending of His only begotten Son - in whom all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell¹ - in great humility to take our nature upon Himself and to born of a pure Virgin. This is what we call to mind and celebrate tonight as we open the Scriptures and raise our voices in songs of praise and thanksgiving.

Though this beautiful tradition begun over 130 years ago has indeed reached great heights of sophistication and fame, we remember that it began, not unlike the sacred story we hear this evening, in the humility of a temporary home. Let us be glad then, that we are able to join together as sisters and brothers to hear again that our lives have meaning and purpose in Christ, and that the invisible God loved the world in this way: that He sent His only Son Jesus Christ, who is His image, to be born and dwell amongst us, not to condemn the world, but that the world might healed and saved through trusting in Him — the One who *is* love, and *is* light, in a frightened, darkened world.

It is good to have you with us this evening, and if this is your first time with us, I pray that you will find a warm welcome!



*The cover image is a contemporary Eastern Orthodox icon of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, painted in a traditional style. You will note that Christ is lying in cave, which was in fact a common place to stable animals in that part of His world. This also reflects the words of the Prophet Isaiah (ch.45:8) "let the earth open, and let them bring forth salvation". The infant Christ lies in a manger which also resembles a coffin, and the cave the tomb He was laid in after His Passion and Death, reminding us that it was for this reason that Son of God came to dwell among us, that He might save us by His death and Resurrection. There are images of Christ being washed by midwives and a somewhat bewildered St Joseph talking with an old man, said to be the devil tempting him not to believe in this miraculous birth. The angels, shepherds and wise men are also seen, along with The Blessed Virgin Mary, treasuring, as it says in St Luke's Gospel, all these amazing things in her heart.
