




Our study times were based around the theme of 'Living Stones.' While we were there, one of our number, Susan Edmondson, wrote the following poem. You may remember Susan as the wife of Bishop Chris Edmondson, Bishop of Bolton from 2008-16. Though now retired, they are both active in their local church in their home city of Bradford, and Bishop Chris is now chaplain to Yorkshire County Cricket Club at Headingly. He recently gave the address at the funeral of the legendary cricket umpire, Dickie Bird.

### Stones
