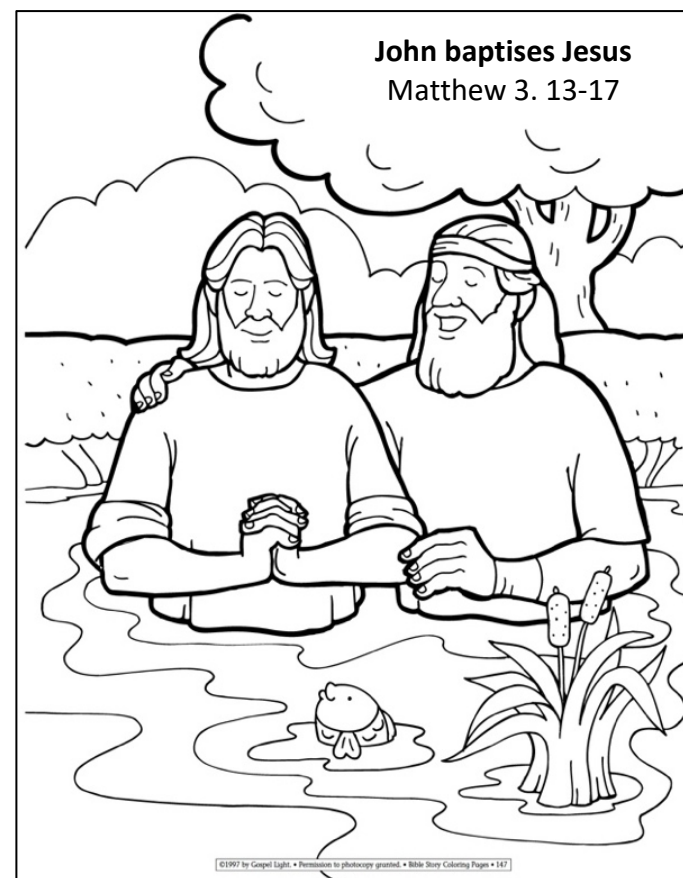


ACCESSIBILITY FOR ALL
