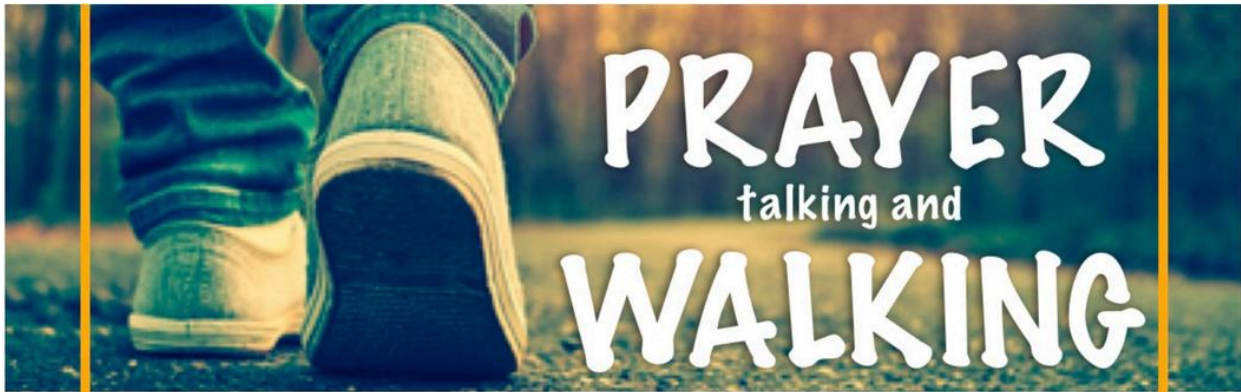

ETTINGTON COMMUNITY CENTRE - Use It, Love It, Keep It Going

At the heart of Ettington sits a building that many of us know well but perhaps don't always think about: **Ettington Community Centre**. Built in 2002, it replaced the old village hall that had served the community for decades before it, and it was created for one simple reason - **to give Ettington a place to come together**.

Over the years, the Centre has hosted village breakfasts and bingo, parties and celebrations, concerts and pantomimes, club meetings, exhibitions, fairs and so much more. It's a space for all ages, all interests and all corners of village life - quite simply, a **community hub**.

We're also incredibly proud of how forward-thinking the Centre is when it comes to sustainability. The building has a large array of **solar PV panels** on the roof, generating up to **15kWh** of clean energy. This is supported by a **Tesla Powerwall battery system**, allowing us to store up to **50kWh** of electricity for later use. Heating is provided by an **energy-efficient ground source heat pump**, and we've installed **LED lighting** in the car parks, with plans to upgrade lighting throughout the building. Later this year, we're also planning to install **thermal insulation** to further improve efficiency.

All of this is part of a long-term commitment to make the Community Centre as **green and sustainable as possible for the future** - good for the environment and essential for keeping running costs under control.

However, like any building now over **20 years old**, time is starting to show. Small cracks in the fabric of the building are appearing - completely normal, but not something we can ignore. These issues need to be repaired before they become bigger (and more expensive) problems, and that means raising funds to look after the building properly.

The Centre is managed by a very **small team of volunteers** who give their time, energy and skills to keep everything running - from bookings and maintenance to finances and compliance. They do an amazing job, but they can't do it alone. We would love to welcome more people to help, whether your interest is in **maintenance, fundraising, grant applications, event planning**, or simply lending a hand now and then.

And finally - a heartfelt ask.

The Community Centre exists **for the community**. Its future depends on being **used, supported and valued**. While the hall is busy at times, there are still plenty of quieter slots during the week. More bookings, more events and more involvement all help to keep the Centre viable.

So please:

- Come along to events
- Support village activities
- Consider hiring the space for your next party or celebration
- Think about volunteering with us
- Spread the word

In short - use it, or risk losing it.



If you'd like to get involved or find out more, we'd love to hear from you. Together, we can make sure Ettington Community Centre remains a thriving, welcoming space for many years to come.

REPORTS FROM ETTINGTON PARISH COUNCIL



Appointment of a New Councillor

The Parish Council welcomed **Tony Holdsworth**, who has been co-opted as a councillor. One vacancy on the Council remains, and any resident interested in serving is encouraged to contact the Parish Clerk for further information.

Traffic Speed and 20mph Discussions

County Councillor David Curtis updated councillors on ongoing discussions with Warwickshire Highways regarding the possible introduction of a 20mph speed limit through the village. As part of this work, an advisory 20mph limit around the school, operating during school hours, is being investigated and costed.

Councillors were advised that Warwickshire Highways and the police currently hold differing views on whether a 20mph speed limit should be introduced. Discussions are ongoing with the relevant portfolio holder at Warwickshire County Council, who has visited the parish and observed traffic speeds firsthand. Support has also been requested from the local MP, Manuela Perteghella.

Banbury Road Crossroads and Local Highway Improvements

A proposed design from Warwickshire Highways for improvements to the staggered crossroads on Banbury Road was considered. Many residents and councillors felt that the scheme did not go far enough and could represent poor value for money. Traffic lights were ruled out due to cost. The option of a roundabout has been discussed with the portfolio holder and formally noted.

The Parish Council agreed to write to the Director of Highways at Warwickshire County Council, the relevant portfolio holder, the Police and Crime Commissioner, and the local MP, seeking their combined support for a more appropriate scheme. The Council also asked for a joined-up approach to improvements along the full stretch from the crossroads through the village.

More locally, requests have been made for the repainting of white and yellow lines around the school, the repainting of the school crossing, and improvements to the chicane outside The Chequers.

CCTV Update

CCTV remains on the Council's agenda. A response is still awaited from officers at Stratford-on-Avon District Council.

Budget and Precept for 2025/26

The Council discussed the budget and precept in detail. Increasing financial pressures were noted, including costs associated with repairs and improvements to the Community Centre following the Council's role as trustee, contributions towards highway projects, football field maintenance, and the need to maintain adequate reserves for the playground.

It was agreed that the precept should be set at £95,000. This represents an increase of £36 per annum, 69p per week for a Band D household.

Extraordinary Meeting: Planning Application at Rookery Lane

An Extraordinary Meeting of the Parish Council was held in January to consider planning application **25/02798/FUL** for the construction of four dwelling houses, access improvements, and associated works, including the demolition of the existing dwelling and ancillary buildings at The Dolls House, Rookery Lane.

The Council carefully considered concerns raised by residents. The proposal was assessed against the Neighbourhood Plan, which supports infill housing within the built-up boundary. On this basis, the Council could not object to the application. However, it was agreed that formal comments should be submitted to Stratford-on-Avon District Council, requesting careful consideration of key issues raised by residents, including flooding, the removal of trees protected by Tree Preservation Orders, and the impact on drainage.

Next Parish Council Meeting

The next meeting of Ettington Parish Council will take place on **Wednesday, 11 February, at 7.30 pm** in the **Community Centre**. All residents are welcome to attend.

Astronomical Society News *by Adrian Wakeham and Dave Benton*

The Stratford-upon-Avon Astronomical Society meets **every first and third Tuesday at 8pm (doors open at 7.30pm) at Alderminster Village Hall**. Everyone is welcome, especially beginners and those wanting to learn more. The first Tuesday is a club night, in February that will be on

3rd February and the speaker on the third **Tuesday, 17th February 2026**, will be Professor Susanne Schwenzer from the Open University, with a talk called “13 years and counting: Curiosity at Gale Crater, Mars”. Please note that the speakers usually start quite promptly at 8pm.

Each month one of our members, Adrian Wakeham, writes an article on aspects of astronomical observation.

The planets this month

Recently, these articles have not mentioned much about the planets and what they have been doing. This is mainly due to many of them being poorly positioned over the summer and autumn for evening viewing. A big issue are clouds and a nearly full moon. The bright moonlight which will drown out the stars and planets. The best time to observe the night sky is when the moon is at first or last quarter or less.

This month, things are improving. Firstly, on **Monday, 16th**, Saturn and Neptune are in conjunction with each other. (Visually, they are within a degree of each other.) They are to be found in the west at sunset, below the square of Pegasus. Saturn is yellowy-brown in colour and with binoculars, the rings might be visible. In the same field of view Neptune will be visible, although not easy to see, and you really need a telescope, as might be Titan, Saturn’s largest moon..

Jupiter has been improving as the winter draws on, it reached opposition on January 10th. This means Earth is positioned directly in between the sun and Jupiter, so in February, it will be at its closest to Earth and will be high and bright, making this one of the best times to observe the gas giant and its moons.

As Mercury continues to rise above the western horizon, it will join Venus (in conjunction). Venus is really easy to spot, being the exceptionally bright ‘star’ in the west. This will happen on **Friday, 27th February**, and on the next day the press will get all excited, as 7 of the 8 planets will be visible as well as a virtually full moon.

Saturn, Neptune, Venus and Mercury will be close to the western horizon, shortly after sunset and will disappear below the horizon within 90 minutes. If you head east, you’ll find the Pleiades or seven sisters cluster, where you can see a number of the stars, but with binoculars, you will see many, many more, then slightly south of the Pleiades you will see a green ‘star’. This is the planet Uranus.

Continue east, and just below Gemini’s Castor and Pollux, will be another bright ‘star’. This is Jupiter. With binoculars, you should see some of the 4 Galilean moons. With a telescope you should be able to make out the bands and the great red spot.

So, Jupiter, Saturn, Neptune, Venus, Mercury and Mercury are the six planets mentioned so far, the 7th one you can see, if you look down rather than up, is, of course, the Earth, a great and

wonderous place, not to be ignored or abused. The planet missing out on the party is Mars. At the moment it is pretty much behind the sun, (in conjunction with the Sun on 9th January). Club nights offer more information on what to look out for each month. If it is clear we do some observing just outside the Village Hall, so please join us. 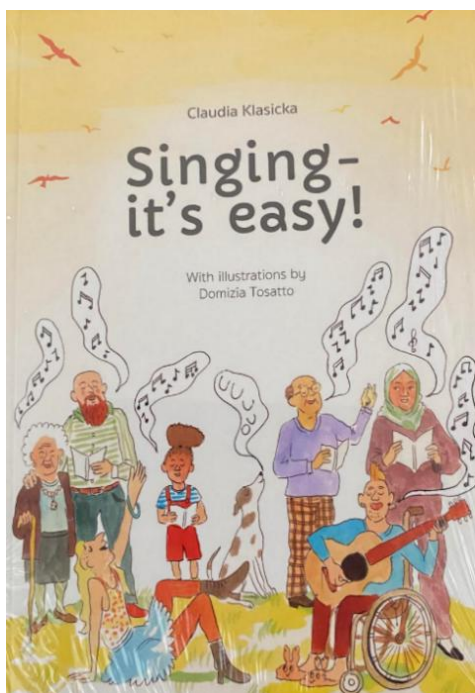

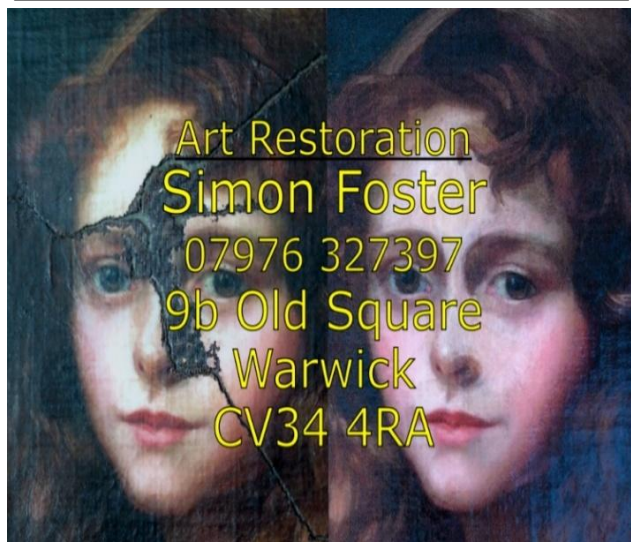
