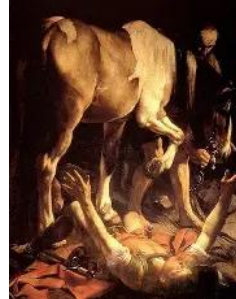
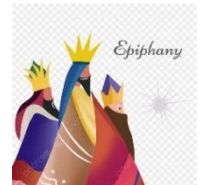

The **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2026** will be observed from January 18 to January

25 this year. It is an annual event that invites Christians from all denominations to come together in prayer for unity. The theme for 2026 is inspired by Ephesians 4: 4, which emphasizes the unity of the church: 'There is one body and one spirit, just as you were called to one hope of your calling.' The theme for this year has been prepared by the Armenian Apostolic Church along with the Armenian Catholic and Evangelical Churches, drawing on centuries-old traditions of prayer and hymns from Armenia. The Week of Prayer offers a significant opportunity for Christians to come together in prayer and worship, reflecting on their

shared faith and commitment to unity. During the week we ask you to pray for the church in the world, using the prayer below. A service to mark the end of the week will be held at St Paul's Church on **Sunday 25 January** at 3pm. This will be a Mission Community and Churches Together in Prestwich event, led by Rev David Cooper, Mission Community leader and Rector of St Mary's Prestwich. Please join us on this special occasion.
