

IJM are running a series of Prayer for Justice events around the country in February and we are delighted to be hosting one at St. Chads on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> Feb. We`d love to invite you and your church to come and join us.

I know it`s not easy to persuade anyone in our church to travel midweek to other church for events like this, but I do hope there might be some who share a kingdom passion to see an end to human trafficking who might go for it. It would be great to draw folk from around our area to be a part of the evening. As well as praying, we hope that it`s a powerful time of worship and encountering God together too, so come for time in God`s Presence.



Jill Hookway who is running it writes:

I care soooo deeply about those trapped in slavery, trafficking, violence. Especially women and children. Especially those trapped in sex-trafficking and slavery. Too many to think of. # PANCAKES and beyond!

It's not many weeks until we'll be eating Pancakes, and getting ready for LENT. So why not start to plan ahead?

Traditionally Lent has been a time of reflection, of looking at ourselves and acknowledging our flaws and weaknesses, and bringing them before God, to thank him for his goodness in sending Jesus to offer us hope and a better way to live, one that leads to fullness of life trusting in Him. As a part of this, for centuries people have "given things up for Lent", be it rich food (now usually Chocolate and alcohol), or a leisure activity, or more recently TV!

People used to give things up for lent, as an act of discipline, to honour God, by showing him that he was more important than whatever we'd given up. This discipline mirrored (in a small way) the sacrifice that Jesus made on our behalf.

"Giving things up for Lent" has remained a part of our culture for many, even though they don't make any connection with Jesus through it. Instead, they recognise value in the self discipline that it requires as part of a 'personal improvement plan', much like a New Year Detox, or a diet before a Summer Holiday.

## So What About THIS Lent – what are you going to do?

I would like to encourage you to think carefully in the next few weeks about both '*giving up*' and '*taking up*' for Lent.

Ask God what he'd like you to '*give up for Lent*'? What is important in your life (would you miss it?), that you could honour God through? If it's coffee, then every time you are offered one, or think about one, you could offer a prayer of thanks to Jesus instead, or have a bible verse in your pocket to take out and read. If it's TV, why not take time to talk to people and to God (Pray) instead?

But also ask God what to '*take up for Lent*'? You could commit to spending 15minutes (extra) each morning talking and listening to Jesus. You could choose to give a gift to someone unexpected each week to bless them, or invite someone around for a coffee/meal each week, (but not just the usual people).

As a church we will be reading through the events of the last week of Jesus' life, starting with an early Palm Sunday on the 1<sup>st</sup> March, then each Sunday thinking through another part of Holy Week, until Jesus' crucifixion on Good Friday, and resurrection on Easter Sunday (Details below).



You could choose to read through the events of Jesus' life and death in gospel of Luke, again during the week, and discover who Jesus was, what he was like, and what he did for humanity.

Have a plan, before Pancake Day, and choose how you can make the most of lent, to grow in faith and love for Jesus?
