FIRST READING Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a

A reading from the Book of Deuteronomy.

Moses spoke to the people: You shall remember the whole way
that the LORD your God has led you these forty years in the
wilderness, that he might humble you, testing you to know what
was in your heart, whether you would keep his commandments
or not. And he humbled you and let you hunger and fed you
with manna, which you did not know, nor did your fathers know,
that he might make you know that man does not live by bread
alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth
of the LORD.

Do not forget the LORD your God, who brought you out of the
land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, who led you through
the great and terrifying wilderness, with its fiery serpents and
scorpions and thirsty ground where there was no water, who
brought you water out of the flinty rock, who fed you in the
wilderness with manna that your fathers did not know.

ACCLAMATION BEFORE THE GOSPEL John 6:51

I am the living bread that came down from heaven,
says the Lord.

If anyone eats of this bread, he will live for ever.

GOSPEL John 6:51-58

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

At that time: Jesus said to the Jews, 'I am the living bread that
came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will
live for ever. And the bread that I will give for the life of the
world is my flesh.' The Jews then disputed among themselves,
saying, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' So Jesus
said to them, 'Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh
of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you.
Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal
life, and I will raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is true
food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever feeds on my flesh
and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him. As the living
Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever
feeds on me, he also will live because of me. This is the bread
that came down from heaven, not like the bread the fathers
ate, and died. Whoever feeds on this bread will live for ever.'
