The Fulford Tapestry depicts the Battle of 1066 and the events leading up to it.

It was designed by Bletchington resident Charles Jones and completed over seven years by a team of embroiderers using authentic materials and techniques.



10am-12noon - Charles Jones will be present to give explanatory talks.

2pm to 4pm - Plant dying and embroidery workshops will be held.

The workshops will show how to dye wool, from sheep on Adam Henson's farm, with plant dyes grown in Bletchington.

As well as offer lessons in the art of embroidery. You may like to stitch your own scene or contribute to a new tapestry based on the life of St Giles!

but there will be a small charge for the workshops.
