The Book Group is reading *I, Julian* by Claire Gilbert, to discuss at the next meeting. This is a fictionalised autobiography of Julian of Norwich, a medieval woman who dares to tell her own story, battling grief, plague, the church and societal expectations to do so. Compelled by the powerful visions she had when close to death, Julian finds a way to live a life of freedom – as an anchoress, bricked up in a small room on the side of a church – and to write of what she has seen. The result, passed from hand to hand, is the first book to be written by a woman in English.
