Barry Blackford writes on Philippians 2 "Shining"

A torch, no matter how small the beam and weak the battery casts light into a dark place, the stronger the beam, the more we can see, but even the weakest light can be seen from far further than we can see with it. Over the last few weeks in Breakfast@9 we have been looking at Paul's letter to the Philippians and his teaching on what it means to be a follower of Jesus' Way, a way that we now call being a Christian. Paul tells us that Jesus' followers shine like "stars in the sky," or

"lights in the world". This, Paul says, comes through living obediently; just as Jesus obeyed his Father, so we must obey our Father as well. This obedience mustn't be an attempt to earn our salvation because Jesus has already earned it for us. However, Paul says that we do need to "work out" our salvation. Note he says "work out", not "work for", our salvation. Our obedience comes out of our love for Jesus and the Father. Unlike following a religion, which says, 'I obey, therefore I'm accepted', Jesus' followers say, 'I'm accepted, therefore I obey'. What he is saying is that by working out our salvation we are trying to act in line with our salvation which means obeying Christ in every aspect of our lives. Jesus told his followers, also called disciples, that they should be disciplemaking disciples that is why true followers of Jesus want to tell others about him rather than keeping him to themselves and Paul finishes this part of the letter off with a couple of examples of true disciples; Timothy and Epaphroditus.

Phil Clements on Philippians 4 "Content in Christ"

How content do you feel? Many of us might say it depends on what we mean by being content. A dictionary definition is helpful here — "a state a peaceful happiness". Do you sometimes find yourself saying "if only..." If only I had this or that, if only this situation would change — then things would be different and I would be ...content. Sadly the realities of our lives are that when one of our "if only's" is satisfied then another will take its place.

Paul had *learned* that deep contentment was independent of our physical circumstances, and unrelated to what we have or do not have. For him, ultimate, lasting and deep contentment was to be found in Jesus. He talks about 'learning the secret'...

Philippians 4:12b-13 "...I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do all this through him who gives me strength".

As we take another step forward in our personal walk with Jesus we would do well to share in this secret. We can understand from this passage (4:10-20) how Paul learned to be content in Christ in terms of three dimensions. First – Christian generosity – the Philippians supported Paul generously and self-sacrificially. Second – Christian discipline – we can make a proactive decision not to *covet* - that yearning to possess something that someone else has. Third – Christian trustfulness. Paul knew, and trusted in the truth of what he says in verse 19 "And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of His glory in Jesus Christ".

A question for us all is "where does our contentment lie"? I'm reminded of the words of the lovely song by Stuart Townend: 'In Christ alone my hope is found...' Listen to the full lyrics here.

Knowing God & Making God Known

ONE. STEP. FORWARD...

We all need a bit of a nudge, and coronavirus won't stop us from keeping the important things at the forefront in our lives as Christians. Here and at the St Mark's part of our parish website we list a number of ideas and resources that can support you in your walk with Jesus. Please see the website for further links and updates.

Explore Jesus - How can I know if I am really a Christian at all? This is the place to start. God has made you for a relationship with him. See the website for a couple of links you could follow to explore Jesus' his invitation to life, hope, forgiveness and eternal love. But getting involved in any of the things listed on this page will help you to discover where you are with God.

Join 'Dig Deeper' - A short course on getting the most out of the Bible Five Tuesday evenings this Autumn with Phil Clements exploring ways to really hear God through his word, *from 17th November* in Zoom.

Read the Bible - Commit to a daily reading plan and personal time with Jesus. Sanctification doesn't generally happen in leaps and bounds. It's a constant, daily and hourly process of God working in us, as we read his word, reflect, and pray. See the website for some tips. See Andy for some materials to support you.

Explore Prayer - By joining 'What happens when we pray'
Sunday evenings at 6pm with Jo King *from 25th October* - first meeting in Zoom but maybe moving to St Mark's. This will start as a book discussion group reading "What happens when women pray" experimenting in praying the Evelyn Christensen way.

Join a Group - One of our many Housegroups that meet midweek. This Autumn many of our housegroups will be following the Sunday series in 1 Thessalonians, but house groups are about far more than bible study, they are an opportunity to process faith and life together with others who care about you. Please see our housegroup list at the website and get in touch with Mary or a house group leader to come along for a taster. Most of them are currently meeting in Zoom.

Explore Evangelism - Be inspired to share your faith along with others. Andy will be hosting a group exploring the ideas in the book 'Natural Evangelism' by J.John. One session *monthly starting soon* and through the Winter and Spring on Zoom for anyone who knows in their heart that Jesus is good news for people but feels unsure where to start and would value the support of others as we seek to do this.

Read 1-2-1 - And enjoy God's word with others.

We all know the value of sharing a meal with others. Reading the Bible is similar to eating food—we can do it alone, but we're missing something if we never share it with others. See some tips for getting started at the website.

Come and Pray - At St Mark's 9.30am every Sunday and every First Wednesday of the month for a new magazine-style prayer and sharing time 7.30-8.30pm on Zoom.

Journal with God - Try taking notes on sermons, and when meeting with God noting reminders for reflection or sharing with others later in the week. See website for tips.
