From the Vicarage

Friday 26 February

If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.

Mark 8.34b

The last few weeks have been a time of self-denial for many of us as we have travelled through this most recent lockdown. Once more there are things we have not been able to do, people we have not been able to see and places we have not been able to go. So, when we came around to asking ourselves the question on Ash Wednesday “what have I given up for Lent”, for some there didn’t seem that there was that much left.

In that context, these last few months may have been a time of serious soul searching and an opportunity to examine some fundamental questions about life, its purpose, the relationships within it, and how we understand faith in God in the midst of everything else that is going on.

St Mark's Gospel reminds us very clearly of the Gospel imperative that we become fully dependent upon God and seek in complete faith to follow him as disciples. Even if that means we step forward with something as difficult and complex as a cross to bear. To step forward in this way is to sit light to the fears and concerns of the past, to focus on the hopes and assurance we have in Christ and to have the capacity to take risk and respond to opportunity. So let us have the courage to let go and depend on him as we emerge from this time of lockdown and lent as changed people. For as we get ever closer to Easter we are reminded of the hope of resurrection and the promise of eternal life.

Responding to the Prime Ministers announcement on 22 February, the Bishop of London, Sarah Mullally, who chairs the Church of England's Coronavirus Recovery Group, said *"I am grateful to the Prime Minister for sharing these proposals to ease the current restrictions in a way which gives us all some clarity and enables people to begin to plan. We will study the details and, working with Government Departments, refine our own advice for local churches in the weeks ahead"*. PCC's will meet to decide how this might look for us in the weeks ahead especially for easter.
