PRAYING ROUND THE PARISH.All who live, work and worship in the Old Town Parish.

The Annual Parish Church Meetings: These will be held towards the end of May and the date will be agreed at Tuesday's PCC.

Electoral Roll: This is open to anyone who lives outside the parish and who has been a regular worshipper here for at least six months and to any baptized member of the Church of England who lives within the parish boundary whether they worship here regularly, occasionally or not at all. The roll currently stands at 89. The end of year target is 100. The Roll is one indication of the wider support a church enjoys in the community and is a factor in grant applications. Please contact Jean Donaldson if you think you may not be on the Roll but should be or know someone who isn't on the Roll but ought to be.

Sunday attendance: Another target is to increase our average Sunday attendance to fifty by the end of the year in order to demonstrate our viability as a parish. The number of worshippers in church doesn't tell everything about the spiritual life of a parish but it is a visible indication. There were thirty-seven worshippers last Sunday, an increase of seven since our last Sunday Service in St Clement's in September. There are obviously people who are shielding and no-one should feel under pressure to attend. But you will literally count if you are able to come!

No Mothering Sunday posies, alas: There are no posies available today because of the covid-19 health protocol concerning the amount of handling involved. We look forward to their return next year.
