PRAYING ROUND THE PARISH.All who live, work and worship in the Old Town Parish.

The Annual Parish Church Meetings: These will be held on Wednesday, 12th May starting at 7.30 p.m. (Venue tbc).

Safeguarding Officer: Pat Lock will be standing down as Safeguarding Officer and Vice-Chairman of the PCC at the 2021 APCM and as churchwarden at the 2022 APCM (assuming she is elected at this year's meeting for one further year). This is not phased retirement but to enable Pat to concentrate upon her ministerial role as Reader! We therefore need a new Safeguarding Officer. Please consider whether this might be a role for you and you can chat to Pat or Paul about it with no obligation to buy, as they say in the best shops.

Attendances in March: 7th March - 37 (collection including envelopes: £334.60), 14th March - 38 (collection: £104)

Crypt Repairs: The crypt is currently being cleared of unwanted items in preparation for the provision of storage space necessitated by the move of the parish office. Work on the windows to make it damp proof will cost £2,160 including VAT. The parish finances are looking increasingly stretched, not helped by the loss of income from hall bookings, fund raising and collections in church. We would not be a going concern without the extraordinary generosity of a small number of church members, one of whom has already pledged £500 towards the cost. The parable of the Widow's Mite is of distinct relevance here with its call for sacrificial generosity from us all.

Book Sale: Carol Ridge and Laurence Homewood are kindly organising a weekly book sale (starting next Sunday, 28th). So please bring any unwanted paperback books in good condition to church and leave them by the food bank basket near the west door. Thank you in advance!

Organ Concerts: Malcolm Lock has arranged the 2021 season which we very much hope will be able to ahead. Details may be found on the All Saints' Website.

For Whom the Bell tolls: There will be one minute's national silence this coming Tuesday (23rd) at 12 noon to remember everyone who has died of Covid-19 since the first lockdown twelve months ago. At 12.01 a bell will be tolled in both of our churches to mark this occasion. Paris Nolan will be ringing at St Clement's and Rosemary Smith and Sue Wells at All Saints.

Fancy That! The parish share (then known as the parish quota) was £60 in 1939 and we managed to pay most of it. This is the equivalent of just over £4,000 in today's money. The full parish share in the Diocese of Chichester
