July Focus:

Lucy Monk- Interserve (3) (LaBBS) Due to the COVID peak the Literacy and Basic Business Skills (LaBBS) classes were suspended for a few weeks. but the teachers have decided that they need to help students keep their momentum of gaining literacy skills going and so plan to meet with the women in small groups once a week. This year we have expanded the project and now have 7 teachers, each with 2 classes and a total of about 280 women. Four of these classes are in the IDP camps which is a new experience for the teachers as well as the women there - many of whom don't speak the same mother tongue as the teachers and so the teachers have been learning a new language at the same time as teaching the women to read and write in an unfamiliar

language! Despite all the odds, learning just as well as any in the rest of the classes! In March, coinciding with World Women's Day, the LaBBS classes of 2020 had their graduation ceremony -200 women who have learned to read and write and many of them with stories of how their lives have changed and how they have been able to start up a small home-based business and supplement their family's meagre income.

(4) (ILD) The graduation of last vear's Institute of Leadership Development (ILD) class was also held in March, just after the new class for 2021 had begun. During the month of fasting (in April / May) the classes have a break but we held "Iftar" (when the fast is broken at dusk) pot-luck suppers for both this and last year's classes and it was a privilege to be together with the students as they broke their fast and had much fun and laughter! The classes have now moved again to online, with a few students who don't have internet allowed to come to class. Before I came away I was able to meet one-to-one with a number of the students for "coachina" sessions - often an opportunity for them to talk over issues with someone from outside their family or other close circles of friends or work colleagues.

Hello Torchlighters!. No I haven't gone bonkers. This will make sense very soon. This week the Church is looking at 2 Samuel 7: 1-14a. We will be looking at a little bit of it today.

The Story

So, King David has brought the Ark to Jerusalem. He then sits down on his new Ikea sofa (or equivalent for those times) and looks around his fine, luxury living room. He thinks to himself, "blimey, you know what, here I am sitting in this palace of a house, and where is God's house?

The presence of God had of course been in the ark. You know, the big gold box with the two gold angel statues sat on the top. Tents had been made in the past to house the ark as the people moved around quite a bit, but David now decides that a proper house should be built instead. He wants to do something for God. Basically, because David thought that God was more important than him and God should have a better house than him. They are going to hang around in Jerusalem and not travel around anymore (so the tents can go on eBay now).

So, what do you think God said? Very nice thank you, a very good idea, please can you build it on a hill with a view of the whole city? God said no. He said that He would build a house for David. God wanted to do things for David, not let David do things for Him on this occasion.

For starters, why would David need another house? God said that He will build a house meaning a "Kingdom" for David. That David's family after he has died will continue to be the Kings of the people after him. God said that one of them would build a house for Him. (this ended up being David's son Solomon). God also said that one of David's descendants will build a kingdom to last forever. Now we can play the "Spot Jesus in the old testament game" again. Yes, Jesus was a descendant of David and He is the only one who can rule a kingdom forever.

Once again, the usual question.

What has this to do with me nowadays?

John F Kennedy, once an American president said "Ask not what your country can do for you, ask what you can do for your country". Now for us and God it is kind of the other way round. We might say Don't ask what you can do for God, ask God what He can do for you. Feels a bit cheeky doesn't it. One of the big differences between the Christian faith and other religions is that Christians can say this, that it pleases God when we let him do things for us. Other religions say that they have to work for God to please Him.

It is of course great to do some good things and say it is for God, but first you have to get your head around the Him doing things for us bit. He loves us so much. When we have problems or need assistance, we can pray and ask God to help us. We can always trust Him that He will be with us through good and bad times.

Here is an example. I had a problem recently. I spoke to God about it whilst driving my car. A bible verse came into my head which gave me so much help. I then turned on the music on and the words of the worship song were of this bible verse. When I got to where I was going I was diverted somewhere where I do not usually go. I looked up and there on the wall was a poster on the side of a church with the same bible verse on it. I then had so much peace. This is only one example and lots of people have great stories of how God has helped them.

We need to be prepared and be constantly seeking and learning from God to do His works. Before the disciples went out to do good things, they had lived with Jesus for three years, they had learnt that they are loved by God and had lots of schooling. They still could not go out until the Holy Spirit of God had fallen on them to assist them in their tasks. God gave to them. Elsewhere in the bible, God says that He doesn't even like work or anything done for Him unless it is done in love.

So Guys, I would say listen and learn everything you can about following Jesus in any way you can. There is so much on youtube that you can watch and so many books. When you are in a church group and at home keep those little ears of yours soaking up the words. Nothing else that you could ever learn in your life will be as helpful or important.
