Have you ever thought it was time for you and/or a family member to think a bit more seriously about your Christian faith? What does that faith mean when we are confronted with big questions? What is the purpose of life? Why do people have to die? What happens after death?

Where do we find answers to these and other questions? Christians through the centuries have turned towards the Bible and the Church for answers.

We will be exploring such questions with those who would like to consider being confirmed in the Church of England and those who want to know more about the essentials of the Christian faith.

There is no 'right' age to be confirmed. For some it might be as a twelve-year-old. I was almost 30 and I have walked alongside someone in their 80s who wished to be baptised and confirmed.
