Pet Service

On **Sunday 25th July at <u>10am</u>** we have a joint benefice service at **St. Mary's** with the theme of pets and animals. And you get to bring your pets to church (if you want to)!

The bringing of animals into church has a deep symbolic importance. It symbolises both God's care for all creatures, and also the need for humanity to care for animals. It also provides a practical glimpse of the biblical vision of

creation in praise.

The service is open to all: I hope you might invite friends and neighbours to join us. And of course you can come if you don't have a pet, or choose to not bring your pet with you.

Note: Younger children who bring companion animals to church should always be accompanied by an adult. Animals should be transported and handled appropriately in accordance with RSPCA advice on pet care. Fresh drinking water should always be available, and animals should not be pla ced alongside other species with whom they don't get on well! If you don't want to bring your pet, you may choose to bring a photo or some other representation instead.
