

It is our aim to keep our congregation and their families as safe as possible as far as it is within our gift.

THE ANGELS KEEP THEIR ANCIENT PLACES

Between Sunday September 26th and Sunday October 3rd, St. Michael-on-Greenhill in Lichfield is planning a Michaelmas celebration, primarily to mark the restarting of many of its activities as the pandemic eases. A series of events is being planned that should appeal to a wide variety of different groups. The overall title is *"The angels keep their ancient places"* from the Francis Thompson poem *"In no strange land"* and most of the events will (perhaps unsurprisingly given the church dedication), be angel themed. There will of course be services of worship, including the Patronal Service on September 26th and a Harvest Family Praise on October 3rd with the usual tin collection for the Food Bank; an "angel trail" in church for children and families; a series of evening talks, each with some sort of angelic connection, ranging across art, theology and history; and tours of the church and churchyard.
