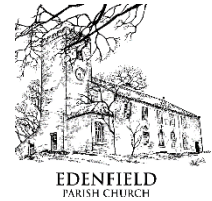

THE EPISTLE **James 1:17-27** ¹⁷ Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, - . . .

Comment from Sue Holdway, our Parish Administrator on James 1 v.19

My parents favourite saying when I was growing up was that: 'I should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry'. Woe betide me if I got in a tizzy through not listening properly, or spoke in anger before thinking and engaging my brain.

Today's reading from James neatly sums up how we should live our lives. We can all pontificate on how good we are at keeping to the rules, and how wonderful our relationship is with God, but let's be honest...none of us is perfect. We start off with all good intentions, appreciating the wonderful gifts that God has given us, feeling grateful; but then our

intentions fall by the wayside when we come across the various trials and tribulations of life. The first challenge we face, we forget everything we have been taught. Verse 24 refers to us staring at our face in the mirror then going out and forgetting who we are and what we stand for. How true is that?

But, if we take a step back and remember what being a Christian is about, life becomes so much more. We don't have to be perfect all the time, (wearing our Sunday best smile) we just need to imagine that every day is Sunday and act accordingly. Not keeping our best behaviour and actions for one special day where it is not natural. We need to relax and let God lead us through all the ups and downs and practicalities of life, remembering the rules.

That's the real relationship that God wants to have with us

THE GOSPEL Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23 The Pharisees and some of the teachers of the law who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus ² and saw some of his disciples eating food with hands that were defiled, that is, unwashed. ³ (The Pharisees and all the Jews do not eat unless they give their hands a ceremonial washing, holding to the tradition of the elders. ⁴ When they come from the marketplace they do not eat unless they wash.
