REFLECTION FOR BIBLE SUNDAY

There is a modern ‘curse’ which one writer described as ‘complacent stupidity.’ You see it on TV quiz shows where the contestant smiles slightly inanely, shrugs their shoulders, and thinks that the answer to ‘which river runs through Norwich?’ is ‘the river Severn?’

It seems that people have forgotten the art of memory, of holding onto facts. What’s the point when you can always Google the information through your phone or computer.

When I was growing up I can remember going to church and sitting with my Dad while Mum was on the choir. I’d open the red Book of Common Prayer (BCP) and try to follow the beautiful, mystical, but to a ten-year old completely unintelligible, words of Morning Prayer. Dad wouldn’t even have taken the book off the shelf. He was word perfect and knew which was the correct Collect for that particular Sunday.

As a teenager I felt that this was just repeating words parrot fashion – how could you really engage with the words without looking at them. So I was, and still am, a fan of Common Worship when it arrived in the year 2000 with its contemporary language and flexibility of structure.

Over recent years I’ve come to not only appreciate and love the words of the 1662 edition of BCP but also understand how deeply rooted they have become in me. I find that I can recite the General Confession, the Apostles Creed, and the Nicene Creed – whole parts of the liturgy that have been, unknowingly, absorbed into my psyche.

And I’ve also come to understand how deeply rooted they were in my Dad’s life. He wasn’t just repeating parrot fashion, these were words that had engrained themselves into his soul.

It’s that sense of rootedness that gives support to daily prayer – having a resource bank for when you can’t think of what to pray or how to phrase your prayer.

Paul writes ‘Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly...’ God’s word ought to be deeply rooted in us, engrained, etched onto our very being. Like the BCP liturgy was in my Dad.

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom, and as you sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God.
