PRAYERS AND READINGS AT THE EUCHARIST

Collect Prayer

Almighty God, who alone can bring order to the unruly wills and passions of sinful humanity: give your people grace so to love what you command and to desire what you promise, that, among the many changes of this world, our hearts may surely there be fixed where true joys are to be found; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever . **Amen**

Old Testament Reading: Jeremiah 17.5-10

17 Thus says the Lord: Cursed are those who trust in mere mortals and make mere flesh their strength, whose hearts turn away from the Lord. ⁶ They shall be like a shrub in the desert, and shall not see when relief comes. They shall live in the parched places of the wilderness, in an uninhabited salt land. ⁷ Blessed are those who trust in the Lord, whose trust is the Lord. ⁸ They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green; in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit. ⁹ The heart is devious above all else; it is perverse—who can understand it? ¹⁰ I the Lord test the mind and search the heart, to give to all according to their ways, according to the fruit of their doings.

Reader: This is the word of the Lord. All: **Thanks be to God.**

Psalm: 1

- ¹ Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers,
- ² but whose delight is in the law of the LORD, and who meditates on his law day and night.
- ³ That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither whatever they do prospers.
- ⁴ Not so the wicked! They are like chaff that the wind blows away.
- ⁵ Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the assembly of the righteous.
- ⁶ For the LORD watches over the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked leads to destruction.

New Testament Reading: 1 Corinthians 15.12-20

15 ¹² Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead? ¹³ If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; ¹⁴ and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. ¹⁵ We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. ¹⁶ For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. ¹⁷ If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. ¹⁸ Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. ¹⁹ If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. ²⁰ But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died.

Reader: This is the word of the Lord. All: **Thanks be to God.**

Gospel Reading: Luke 6.17-26

Reader: Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. All: Glory to you, O Lord.

6 ¹⁷He came down with them and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of Tyre and Sidon. ¹⁸ They had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were cured. ¹⁹ And all in the crowd were trying to touch him, for power came out from him and healed all of them. ²⁰ Then he looked up at his disciples and said: 'Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. ²¹ 'Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled. 'Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. ²² 'Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. ²³ Rejoice on that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets. ²⁴ 'But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. ²⁵ 'Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry. 'Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep. ²⁶ 'Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets. Reader: This is the Gospel of the Lord. All: **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Post Communion Prayer

Merciful Father, who gave Jesus Christ to be for us the bread of life, that those who come to him should never hunger: draw us to the Lord in faith and love, that we may eat and drink with him at his table in the kingdom, where he is alive and reigns, now and for ever. **Amen**

PRAYERS AND READINGS FOR EVENSONG

Psalm 6

- ¹ O LORD, rebuke me not in thine indignation: neither chasten me in thy displeasure.
- ² Have mercy upon me, O Lord, for I am weak: O Lord, heal me, for my bones are vexed.
- My soul also is sore troubled: but, Lord, how long wilt thou punish me?
- ⁴ Turn thee, O Lord, and deliver my soul: O save me for thy mercy's sake.
- ⁵ For in death no man remembereth thee : and who will give thee thanks in the pit?
- ⁶ I am weary of my groaning; every night wash I my bed : and water my couch with my tears.
- ⁷ My beauty is gone for very trouble: and worn away because of all mine enemies.
- ⁸ Away from me, all ye that work vanity: for the Lord hath heard the voice of my weeping.
- ⁹ The Lord hath heard my petition : the Lord will receive my prayer.
- ¹⁰ All mine enemies shall be confounded, and sore vexed : they shall be turned back, and put to shame suddenly.

Old Testament: Wisdom 11.21-12.11

11 ²¹ For it is always in your power to show great strength, and who can withstand the might of your arm? ²² Because the whole world before you is like a speck that tips the scales, and like a drop of morning dew that falls on the ground. ²³ But you are merciful to all, for you can do all things, and you overlook people's sins, so that they may repent. ²⁴ For you love all things that exist, and detest none of the things that you have made, for you would not have made anything if you had hated it. ²⁵ How would anything have endured if you had not willed it? Or how would anything not called forth by you have been preserved? ²⁶ You spare all things, for they are yours, O Lord, you who love the living. 12 ¹ For your immortal spirit is in all things. ² Therefore you correct little by little those who trespass, and you remind and warn them of the things through which they sin, so that they may

be freed from wickedness and put their trust in you, O Lord. ³ Those who lived long ago in your holy land ⁴ you hated for their detestable practices, their works of sorcery and unholy rites, ⁵ their merciless slaughter of children, and their sacrificial feasting on human flesh and blood. These initiates from the midst of a heathen cult, ⁶ these parents who murder helpless lives, you willed to destroy by the hands of our ancestors, ⁷ so that the land most precious of all to you might receive a worthy colony of the servants of God. ⁸ But even these you spared, since they were but mortals, and sent wasps as forerunners of your army to destroy them little by little, ⁹ though you were not unable to give the ungodly into the hands of the righteous in battle, or to destroy them at one blow by dread wild animals or your stern word. ¹⁰ But judging them little by little you gave them an opportunity to repent, though you were not unaware that their origin was evil and their wickedness inborn, and that their way of thinking would never change. ¹¹ For they were an accursed race from the beginning, and it was not through fear of anyone that you left them unpunished for their sins.

Here ends the first lesson

New Testament: Galatians 4 8-20

⁴ Formerly, when you did not know God, you were enslaved to beings that by nature are not gods. ⁹Now, however, that you have come to know God, or rather to be known by God, how can you turn back again to the weak and beggarly elemental spirits? How can you want to be enslaved to them again? ¹⁰You are observing special days, and months, and seasons, and years. ¹¹I am afraid that my work for you may have been wasted. ¹² Friends, I beg you, become as I am, for I also have become as you are. You have done me no wrong. ¹³You know that it was because of a physical infirmity that I first announced the gospel to you; ¹⁴though my condition put you to the test, you did not scorn or despise me, but welcomed me as an angel of God, as Christ Jesus. ¹⁵What has become of the goodwill you felt? For I testify that, had it been possible, you would have torn out your eyes and given them to me. ¹⁶Have I now become your enemy by telling you the truth? ¹⁷They make much of you, but for no good purpose; they want to exclude you, so that you may make much of them. ¹⁸It is good to be made much of for a good purpose at all times, and not only when I am present with you. ¹⁹My little children, for whom I am again in the pain of childbirth until Christ is formed in you, ²⁰I wish I were present with you now and could change my tone, for I am perplexed about you.







