Reflection for The Sunday Next Before Advent, Christ the King

This, the last Sunday in the church's year, we celebrate the feast of Christ the King, our Redeemer King, King of the Creation, whose just and gentle rule is supreme. (Think of Graham Sutherland's tapestry in Coventry Cathedral.)

However, our Gospel reading tells of Christ being mocked as a false messiah by Jewish leaders, Roman soldiers, most likely the onlookers and one of the criminals dying beside him.

Hardly the attributes of a king. The Gospel shows us our king executed as a cursed criminal. His crown - a crown of thorns.

What is it that qualified Jesus for paradise? What turns the crown of thorns into the crown of our heavenly king? In the Gospel there is little sense of regal triumph but there is a lot of grace. There's **forgiveness** - Father forgive them for they know not what they do. There's Christ's **dignity** when he was being mocked and jeered. There's his **steadfastness** when the crowd call on him to save himself. There's

his **compassion**, **understanding** and **friendship** towards the criminal who realises that Jesus, unlike the other two, is innocent.

Isn't this what we'd like from our leaders today?

Power is often both addictive and toxic. Once people have it in their hands, they can find it difficult to let it go and the temptation to abuse power is ever-present. Throughout his life on earth, Christ taught us in so many ways that he did not come to be served but to serve and we are called to the same service. As the old year ends and we look towards Advent, remember that the cross was not the end but that it became the throne of Christ the King, who uses his power to serve and save. In our prayers, let's resolve to follow in the footsteps of Christ our King.

Jeremiah 23:1-6

23 Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the Lord. ² Therefore, thus says the Lord, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock, and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. ¹⁵ He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; ¹⁶ for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. ¹⁷ He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. ¹⁸ He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. ¹⁹ For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ²⁰ and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all

things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

³³ When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. 34Then Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.' And they cast lots to divide his clothing. 35 And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, 'He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!' ³⁶ The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, 37 and saying, 'If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!' 38 There was also an inscription over him, 'This is the King of the Jews.' ³⁹ One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, 'Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!' 40 But the other rebuked him, saying, 'Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? 41 And we indeed have been

Deanery January Service Pattern

This is advance notice that the Deanery Service in January 2023 will be held at 11:00am on 1st January at St Peter's, Gaulby. There will be NO Deanery Service on 29th January (5th Sunday). Parishes are recommended to treat 8th Jan as the 1st Sunday, 15th Jan as the 2nd Sunday, 22nd Jan as the 3rd Sunday, 29th Jan as the 4th Sunday. However, please check with your local church for conformation of the pattern that they are adopting. The normal pattern resumes in February.
