Co-Eco Builders – July: Focus on Plastic Bag Free Day

Following on from last month's World Environment Day 2023 focused on solutions to plastic pollution. This month we are taking a look at plastic carrier bags and recognising International Plastic Bag Free Day on 03 July 2023.

Did you know that approximately 500 billion plastic bags are in use at any one time on a global scale? Many of these bags will end up littered all over the planet having a detrimental effect on the environment, wildlife and human health. The marine ecosystem in particular is suffering immensely as a result of plastic pollution. More than 30 species of marine mammals are known to have ingested marine plastic whilst over 100 species of sea birds have ingested plastic artefacts. In the ocean are massive reefs, floating islands that reach hundreds of miles in length, made up of all sorts of plastic waste including bags. Resulting in many more creatures having become entangled in plastic, including sea lion and seal species.

International Plastic Bag Free Day is dedicated to heightening awareness about these and very real and pressing issues brought about by this most popular of disposable carrying devices. We are reminded that those bags we pick up from the retailers are used for an incredibly short time, usually under 25 minutes, and are then disposed of. They may pass out of our thinking then, but they do not pass out of our world. Plastic bags remain in the world for anywhere from 100-500 years before finally decaying completely. International Plastic Bag Free Day gives us an opportunity to remind ourselves, that every bag we dispose of, effects the lives of everyone in the world for generations to come.

What You Can Do

- Spend time in prayer and considering ways to inhabit our common home more sustainably and take action to preserve creation in all its brilliance and complexity.
- Reduce, reuse, and recycle! If you have some plastic bags lying around, don't throw them away. You can use them as extra bin bags or an alternative to a lunchbox as just a couple of examples.
- Stop using plastic bags. The best way to celebrate is also the easiest to do.
 Wherever you find yourself on July 3rd, from the supermarket to a restaurant, make sure not to use and not to ask for any plastic bags.

Why not sew a Re-useable Shopping Bag?

There are lots of tutorials available on the internet – here is one you could try: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=5drUqZlzycq

You could make your bag more sustainable by recycling some old fabric, such as an unwanted tablecloth or pillowcase, to create your bag.

safe and calm.




