<u>Electoral Roll 2023</u> - It is time to update the church Electoral Roll. This begins from <u>March 19th</u>. This is the nearest thing we have to a membership list- so active committed members of the church are encouraged to be on the roll. It shows we are all part of the church family.

The PCC. and Two Deanery Synod members. Are elected for a three year term. P.C.C. meetings are usually held every 4-6 weeks on a Monday from 7-9pm. Deanery Synod meetings are held 3 times a year. Elected members represent St Mary's Church at the local synod meetings and bring back information regarding national and local matters. The PCC is responsible for planning decisions, safety, finance, and care of the church. Please pray and see if you could take this role. We need a wide variety of gifts and experience. New PCC members are always welcome.

<u>Sides people/Welcome Team</u> - New extra welcome team people are needed. If you are interested please see Sue.

<u>Two new deanary synod representatives</u> are needed.

Co-Eco Builders – March: Focus on Water

Since 1993 the 22 March each year has been an annual United Nations observance day that highlights the importance of fresh water and advocate from



the management of freshwater resources. The theme of each year focuses on

We are in the lucky position that it is easy to take water for granted. It just comes out of the tap anytime you want it. Yet, all over the globe there are people who don't have access to clean, safe drinking water. World Water Day is dedicated to drawing attention to the water-related issues that humans face in almost every country. The goal of World Water Day is to bring aide to people who truly need it across borders

What You Can Do

Why not try to reduce your water footprint as you observe World Water Day?

It may not seem like you use a lot of water in your daily life, but you might be surprised how much water it takes to perform household tasks. Friends of the Earth estimates that every hour you spend in a power shower uses up to 17 litres of water. While a single toilet flush uses between 4 and 6 litres (modern dual flush systems) and 13 litres (older style single flush system). When you consider the average UK household flushes the toilet approximately 5,000 times per year, that could equate to 65,000 litres of water a year going down the toilet!

There are many products, such as low flow toilets and shower heads, that can help with decreasing your daily water usage.

At St. Mary's, we have installed water displacement bags in each of the Cottage Room toilets. A water saving device that sits in the toilet cistern tank,

reducing the amount of water used (saving up to an estimated 4,800 litres of water per year). However, you can make your own following this activity sheet from Severn Trent Water and a few simple materials (and an opportunity to reuse some single use plastic!).


