

REFLECTION - Feast of Christ the King - Revd. Ann Lloyd

On this Sunday, the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year, we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. This Feast Day marks the end of one Liturgical Year and the start of a new one. The Feast of Christ the King is a relatively recent addition to the Anglican Liturgical Calendar although viewing Christ as the King of the Universe dates back to the early Christian church.

In 1925, after the First World War, due to concern about the growth of secularism and nationalism in the world, Pope Pius XI instituted the Feast of Christ the King to remind people of the universal nature of Christ and the connection that we have to one another due to the fact that we are all part of God's creation.

In 1969 Pope Paul VI moved the date of the celebration from All Saints/All Souls in October to its current date on the last Sunday before Advent. In his 2015 Christ the King address Pope Francis stated, "The Kingdoms of this world at times are sustained by arrogance, rivalries and oppression; the Reign of Christ is a Kingdom of Justice, Love and Peace."

STIR UP SUNDAY


THE COLLECT

Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people; that they, plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may of thee be plenteously rewarded; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

SOME THOUGHTS... This Sunday is known as Stir up Sunday.

Traditionally, families would gather together in the kitchen to **stir**, mix and steam Christmas pudding. Parents would teach their children how to mix ingredients for the pudding.

As people took a turn stirring up the pudding mix, some made a special wish. By tradition the pudding mixture is stirred from East to West in honour of the three wise men who started their journey to the baby Jesus. Sometimes silver coins were added to the pudding mix for the lucky person to find on Christmas Day and a reflection of the gifts gold, frankincense and myrrh given to the Christ Child.

READINGS

Ezekiel 34.11-16, 20-24

¹¹ For thus says the Lord God: I myself will search for my sheep, and will seek them out. ¹²As shepherds seek out their flocks when they are among their scattered sheep, so I will seek out my sheep. I will rescue them from all the places to which they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. ¹³I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land; and I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the watercourses, and in all the inhabited parts of the land.

¹⁴I will feed them with good pasture, and the mountain heights of Israel shall be their pasture; there they shall lie down in good grazing land, and they shall feed on rich pasture on the mountains of Israel. ¹⁵I myself will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I will make them lie down, says the Lord God. ¹⁶I will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up the injured, and I will strengthen the weak, but the fat and the strong I will destroy. I will feed them with justice.

²⁰ Therefore, thus says the Lord God to them: I myself will judge between the fat sheep and the lean sheep.

²¹Because you pushed with flank and shoulder, and butted at all the weak animals with your horns until you scattered them far and wide, ²²I will save my flock, and they shall no longer be ravaged; and I will judge between sheep and sheep. ²³ I will set up over them one shepherd, my servant David, and he shall feed them: he shall feed them and be their shepherd.

²⁴And I, the Lord, will be their God, and my servant David shall be prince among them; I, the Lord, have spoken.

Matthew 25.31-end

³¹ 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. ³²All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, ³³ and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. ³⁴Then the king will say to those at his right hand, "Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; 35 for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, ³⁶I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." ³⁷Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? ³⁸And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? ³⁹And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?" ⁴⁰And the king will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." ⁴¹Then he will say to those at his left hand, "You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; ⁴² for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, ⁴³I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me." 44Then they also will answer, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?" ⁴⁵Then he will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me." ⁴⁶And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.'
