What gifts, skills and relationships do I have? What is my contribution? I can't do everything, but there are things only I can do: only I have my particular circle of family and friends.

A lot of life is spent simply getting money in order to pay the bills. But money doesn't offer much illumination on the human condition. Nor is it easy to know where to begin with the great questions of life.

Faith is the business of looking beyond myself for a wisdom greater than my own. I open my bible at Jeremiah: "Stand at the crossroads, and look, and ask for the ancient paths, where the good way is; Paul and walk in it, and you will find rest for your souls."
