<u>Knitting Chicks:</u> We are knitting chicks to stuff with a small Easter egg for the Food Bank to be delivered to your church/Parish Centre by Easter. Please see below the chick pattern.

Chick garter (plain) stitch Pattern: Number 10 needles. Cast on 34 stitches. Knit 2 rows. Increase 1 stitch at beginning of each row until 48 stitches. Knit 3 rows. Cast off 12 stitches at start of next 2 rows (24 stitches). Knit 12 rows. Thread wool through and pull tight. Sew seams, leaving an opening at the bottom to put the egg inside.
