Snowdrops popped up and flowered in the Rectory garden this year in time for Candlemas. And the daffodil stems were well on their way in readiness for Mothering Sunday. Bluebells will be any day now ready to bless woodland walkers; and churchyards will be busy with wildflowers and bees to remind visitors that God's ordered creation brings forth life each year.

The newly formed Benefice Choir have been rehearsing the song 'By Faith' which starts with the words 'By faith, we see the hand of God, In the light of creation's grand design.' And we certainly do here in the parishes of Offwell, Widworthy and Farway. Christians of course, believe that there is a purpose behind the beauty of creation, and through the ordered pattern of life. We see it everywhere, dormant bulbs turn to plants,

withered flowers turn to seed and emerge from the frost covered soil again, winter to spring, death to resurrection.

Many of the saints, mystics, and fathers and mothers of the church have said that God, who is love, wanted to create something to love. In the late fourth century, St. Augustine said that "the church consists in the state of communion of all creation."

Sadly, the climate issue has highlighted how the industrialisation of the western world has led to our separation from creation, and in turn has divorced our lives from the life of all. And we have learnt that this separation is now proving to increase our own suffering, which ironically may well lead us back to a greater sense of spiritual communion with all.

Easter is early this year, a bit like the snowdrops, a nice hint to what St Paul meant when he said, 'for now is our salvation nearer than when we first believed'. During the week before Easter the Church ponders on the profoundly important events of 'Holy Week' and more specifically Jesus' crucifixion. It is before the cross we are confronted with the gut-wrenching truth that in God's own suffering on the cross we consist in the state of communion of all creation.

At Christmas we hear the words of St John 'all things came into being through Him [Christ]'. During Holy Week we learn what these words really means as we are brought together in Christ's suffering, as we can also be in creation's suffering.



OFFWELL CofE PRIMARY SCHOOL

'A Bible story well told has the power to spark the imagination, inspire exploration, give hope, create a smile, teach important lessons and connect generations' - this is what the 'Open the Book' storytelling project is all about.

Every four to six weeks local church volunteers visit St.Mary's and perform



'Open the Book' stories with the children from Offwell School. The church volunteers re-enact, with audience participation, stories from the Bible using 'The Lion Storyteller Bible' created by professional storyteller, Bob Hartman. The Storyteller Bible gives an overview of the Bible from Creation to the Ascension; the aim being to present the Bible in primary schools in an accessible and enjoyable way and to tell the stories in ways which enable the children to engage imaginatively with the text.

'Open the Book' tries to follow Old Testament or New Testament stories which are linked to the Christian festivals calendar. Over the past few visits the children have enjoyed: Daniel in the Lion's Den, Gospel stories of Jesus and Jesus in The Temple as a child.



As well as enjoying the interpretation of the stories the children also thoroughly enjoy participating in the performance. They put on outfits and have a short practice with the group telling them what they need to do. This brings everything to life and helps embed these stories in the minds of children of all ages.


