What do you think about churches baptising asylum seekers? Churches have been accused of facilitating thousands of bogus asylum claims by means of fake conversions. Stories about migrant baptisms have emerged following the horrible chemical attack on a woman and her two children in Clapham. The suspect apparently failed in his first two asylum applications: he succeeded the third time after getting baptised. A priest vouched for his genuine conversion.

All sorts of issues arise. When did the state delegate asylum process to the church? Is baptism to be regarded as a *political* act in this country? Do people really think baptism makes you *British*? It isn't what churches think. Imagine if churches *refused* to baptise people on the grounds that they were asylum seekers...

Jesus said 'My kingdom is not of this world.' Baptism marks the start of Christian pilgrimage: it's a way of declaring you believe in Jesus and that you dedicate your life to following him. But how is anyone to know whether a candidate is sincere or not? Queen Elizabeth I said 'You can't make windows into men's souls.' And you can't - and no one (including priests) should pretend they can.

What if converts promptly stop going to church once they are baptised? I don't think asylum seekers have a monopoly on that.

Is a chemical attack worse because the perpetrator has just got baptised? It certainly makes it more shocking. Christians are supposed to live holy lives of kindness and compassion - to follow the example of the man who stands at the centre of human history. But there are many who want faith without ethics, freedom without responsibility, church without holiness, goodness without godliness. We shouldn't need reminding it can't be done.
