The Promises of Jesus: Our Lent course this year is taking place at All Saints@6, in Little Munden. The subject is the "Promises of Jesus". The remaining sessions are:

10th March The Holy Spirit 17th March Jesus with us

Everyone is very welcome, whether you usually come to All Saints @6 or not!

Lent Appeal: Before Lent, we focussed on our giving, to God and to our churches, through service and through financial support. Once again our Lent appeal is for our ministry and mission in this community. In this case, giving won't be aggregated and shared between our three benefice churches, but will be allocated to the church in which it's given. However, many of our costs are shared, so if you'd like to support the work of the benefice across the board, please let one of our treasurers know and we'll make sure that happens.

Midweek services: How well do you know the book of Lamentations? This week, our Tuesday and Wednesday morning services will start a short series using Lamentations to help us look at Christian lament. After Easter, we will be exploring what Jesus meant by the phrase 'the Kingdom of God' and what it means for us today. All are welcome to these services, where worship is followed by discussion and refreshments.

Palm Sunday: On Sunday 24th March at 6pm in St Mary's there will be a service of music and readings to mark the start of Holy Week. There will be music sung by our benefice choir from Bach's St John Passion and readers will take us through the passion narrative as recorded by John in his gospel. Please do come along as we begin our observance of the holiest of weeks.

Lent course Wednesday evenings 6th to 20th March, 7.30 pm at Bishop's Stortford College: Entitled 'Reality: Is yours authentic or augmented?' this year's Lent Lectures at Bishop's Stortford College will seek to explore the reality of three areas of human existence: Faith, the Environment, and Spiritual Experiences. Long before the advent of Artificial Intelligence humans have been curious to comprehend nature of reality. New technologies only enrich debates within philosophy, politics, religion and science about the reality of the human existence. Tickets are free but must be booked through the college website.
