The Lord is my rock... It's Easter!

Happy Easter! I can't believe it is Holy Week already, we have celebrated Jesus's tri-

umphant arrival in Jerusalem, no donkeys or palms, but a procession of children waving colourful ribbons and palm crosses for all comers here at Brindle St James. We will walk with Jesus to the Cross with our poignant Maundy Thursday service which ends with the silent stripping of the Altar of all its cloths and tableware. A simple reminder of the unique aloneness of Christ as he spends the night inprayer, seeking solace in discussion with the Father until he is arrested. An hour at the Cross marks Good Friday as Jesus faces and succumbs to death on the Cross. A death required to save us, to pay for our sins and to repair the fractured relationship between God and humanity. If you would like to know more about how your money is used, you can read the leaflet produced in June 2023.


