Today's Palm Crosses

are from the African Palms Project. This project was begun in 1965 by Fr. Alan Talbot, an Anglican Priest who served for 6 years as a missionary in the diocese of Masasi Tanzania. The palm crosses are made from dried branches of the dwarf palm, Hyphanea Coriacia, which grow wild in the area, so are not cultivated, or chemically treated. No trees are cut down, only leaves collected. The work of making the palm crosses does not interfere with the villagers' normal work of producing the food they need to live; it provides some much-needed additional income. The crosses are sent once a year to the UK, from where they are packed and sorted for delivery in this country. Profit is used for health and education projects in the Masasi area. Previous projects have included water projects, hostels, and safehouses, work on dispensaries, school equipment and schools for additional needs.
