A very happy Easter to you all.

Mark's account of the resurrection, which is the one set for this year, has a strange ending. The women go to the tomb, find it empty and are told by what Mark describes as a "young man" that Jesus has been raised from the dead and they are to go and tell the disciples that he will meet them in Galilee. Then he ends by saying "They told no one because they were afraid."

Afraid of what? Of the angel? Of ridicule or disbelief? Maybe they were afraid because it just seemed too good to be true. They knew Jesus had died and they knew that when people die they stay dead. Maybe they were afraid that the grief and the trauma had addled their brains; it's not unusual for grieving people to be frightened by the power of their emotions.

So Mark ends with the women in this suspended state between faith and fear, wanting to believe but scared of the consequences. Is that where you are this Easter morning? You have doubts? Of course you do; it's a big thing to believe, it's what you do with those doubts that matters. We know from the other gospels that the women did tell the others and we know how the story unfolds. Their courage in the face of their fear and uncertainty is the start of the real Easter story. That could be true for you as well.
