### A Triumphant Entry... Palm Sunday and beyond.

Over the past weeks our readings have followed Jesus as He travelled from place to place, teaching the crowds in parables, and showing His power in the miracles of healing individuals and feeding large crowds. We have also read of the attempts that Jesus made to teach his twelve chosen disciples what was to happen to Him.

It was in the midst of all this activity that Jesus 'resolutely set out for Jerusalem' [Luke 9: 51]. Passover was approaching and Jesus was aware of the events which would take place during what we describe as Holy Week. 'He will be delivered over to the Gentiles. They will mock him, insult him and spit on him; they will flog him and kill him. On the third day he will rise again'. [Luke 18: 32, 33]

We will no doubt be familiar with the events of the day that Jesus chose to enter Jerusalem. The borrowed donkey, the crowds laying their cloaks on the road and waving palm branches. The crowds were vocal shouting 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!' [Mark 11; 9, 10] To some extent they had recognised that Jesus was the long-predicted Messiah and welcomed Him to Jerusalem. It is clear from the events of the next few days that Jesus did not fulfil their idea of a Messiah. This would be one who would take up arms to free the Jews from centuries of oppression and reinstate them as an independent country. The cries of Hosanna turned to Crucify Him within a few days.

In chapter 53 of the Book of Isaiah we read of one who 'was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain'. [Isaiah 53: 3] and who 'took up our pain and bore our suffering'. [Isaiah 53: 4]. The reason for this is that 'He poured out his life unto death and was numbered with the transgressors. For he bore the sin of many and made intercession for the transgressors'. [Isaiah 53: 12]. In his first letter Peter summed this up as "He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed'. [1 Peter 2: 24]

One day Jesus was speaking to Nicodemus, a Pharisee and member of the Ruling Council, who had recognised that Jesus had been sent by God. The response to Nicodemus included, in the words of Jesus, the well-known summary of His purpose on earth...

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. [John 3:16]
