Passiontide by Rev Peter Davies

What does 'Passiontide' mean? It's the period starting this weekend that journeys towards Holy Week, to Jesus' betrayal, crucifixion, and his glorious resurrection that we will celebrate on Easter Day.

'Passiontide' derives from the word 'Passion', but the way 'passion' is more familiarly used in everyday life is a distant stretch from our Lord's Passion.

'Passion' is THE concept for successful marketing. If you want to sell your product, your advertising must portray the product with passion and emotion. Believe me, it's the subject of academic theses! And the interruptions to your TV viewing that pay for the programme you want to watch uninterrupted are rooted in passion and emotion! To sell your product, advertising researchers identify what are called 'passion points'. Here's an example I've made up: you manufacture electric vehicles (EVs), and your advertising agency discovers that 40% of people who aspire to own an EV are men who like hang- gliding and have a family that loves dogs. The advert will feature father descending from a hang-glider into an EV and speeding off into majestic mountain scenery with a beautiful partner beside him and 2.4 children in the back with a spaniel and Labrador wagging their tails! You think I joke? Watch the TV adverts tonight!

But that sort of passion denies the deep root of the word. Its root is from the Latin 'to suffer'. So, not much suffering for our hang-gliding dad unless he's forgotten to super-charge his EV and there's no mobile signal to get the AA to rescue him from the majestic mountain scenery!

Without Jesus' Passion, our Lord's suffering, he would not be glorified. That is the whole, jagged direction of this Sunday's gospel reading from St John's gospel, chapter 12.20-33. We hear this gospel passage in the full knowledge of the glorious outcome of Jesus' Passion and Good Friday: Easter resurrection! But that was not so on that day for Jesus' followers. They heard Jesus' words presaging his death, and by implication, possibly their own. As his followers, they were to enter his service with no less a commitment than Jesus', and that is still reality today.

This Passiontide, pray for our sisters and brothers in Christ in those parts of the world where their blood crying out from the ground witnesses to their faith and trust in Jesus.
