A reflection for Mothering Sunday by LLM Rachel Cramp

There are many ways to be a mother to others...

This Sunday is the fourth Sunday of Lent - Mothering Sunday, and much as businesses and card shops want us to adopt the American 'Mothers' Day' – to us it is Mothering Sunday!

We probably know the suggested history and tradition of the day, that children, especially daughters who had become domestic servants, who had probably left home as young as aged 10, were given a day off to return home and visit their mothers and family, probably gathering wildflowers from the hedgerows as they walked. And centuries ago, it was also the day that families visited their 'mother' church, the main church or cathedral in the area.

But it was the ever popular 'Call the Midwife' last Sunday, that made such a wonderful point, that there are many ways to be a mother to others. The programme showed how we should value women in all our diversity and complexity, for showing that mother love can be spiritual, adoptive and releasing as well as biological, and indeed Sister Julienne became their 'mother of the year'! Also in the programme we see Shelagh mothering her step-son, her natural son and her foster daughter and adoptive daughter; Nurse Nancy Corrigan who has been reunited with her daughter after years of pretending she was her 'sister' and Violet and Fred Buckle who care for Reggie, a young man with 'Downs syndrome', who came to them when his mother lvy, a cousin of Fred's died; Violet showed such delight in the programme when Reggie called her 'Mum'.

In Isaiah 66 the Lord acknowledges the comfort given by those who mother others, and that he offers the same comfort: "As a mother comforts her child, so I will comfort you; you shall be comforted in Jerusalem," and Jesus on the cross needed to ensure his mother would be cared for after his death. In John 19 we read "When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to his mother, 'Woman, behold, your son!' 27 Then he said to the disciple, 'Behold, your mother!' And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home" and so it was that Mary was cared for by John as if she was his mother, and Mary cared for John as if he was her son.
