¶ NICENE CREED

All kneel as the priest invokes the Holy Spirit and recalls the Last Supper. This acclamation follows

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died: Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

The prayer continues, calling to mind Jesus' death and resurrection and praying for the coming of the kingdom. All respond, **Amen.**

I BREAKING OF THE BREAD

If the peace was not exchanged earlier it follows here. Agnus Dei is sung as the Bread is broken

¶ GIVING OF COMMUNION

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb. Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

Jerusalem is built as a city bonded as one together. It is there that the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord, to praise the name of the Lord.

Communion is offered in both kinds. Please form a line in the centre aisle, receive the Host from the priest in front of the altar, then the Chalice at one of the points at the ends of the aisles, and return to your place by the side aisles. If you do not wish to receive the chalice simply return directly to your seat after receiving the Host.

During Communion the choir sing the chorale Chorale O Mensch Bewein (O man thy grievous sin bemoan) by JS Bach (1685-1750)
